PROPOSAL: Amendatory 47 O. S. § 1135.2

The measure proposes to amend 47 O. S. § 1135.2 by creating a special license plate for current and former members of the 1-179th Infantry.¹ It also proposes to create a special license plate for current and former members of the 2-179th Infantry.¹ Persons applying for such plates must obtain and provide proof of their membership in or association with the applicable Infantry Association.

ATTACHMENT TO FISCAL IMPACT-SB 1866-[Introduced] Prepared February 8, 2014.

The measure proposes to amend 47 O. S. § 1135.2 by creating a special license plate for current and former members of the 1-179th Infantry.¹ It also proposes to create a special license plate for current and former members of the 2-179th Infantry.² Persons applying for such plates must obtain and provide proof of their membership in or association with the applicable Infantry Association.

The plates are to be designed in consultation with the named Infantry.

The statutory fee for the proposed special license plates is \$8 and shall be in addition to all other vehicle registration fees. The \$8 fee is deposited into the Oklahoma Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund to be used for the administration of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act.

There is no estimated change in state revenues or any administrative costs/savings associated with the proposals set forth in SB 1866.
