AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the stricken title, enacting clause
and entire bill and insert

"An Act relating to autism spectrum disorders;
requiring certain coverage for certain treatments;
specifying age and coverage limitations; prohibiting

1 termination or refusal of coverage for certain
2 reasons; stipulating limitations; providing certain
3 construction; specifying maximum benefits under
4 certain coverage; directing Oklahoma Insurance
5 Commissioner to annually adjust certain limits;
6 excluding certain payments from certain calculation;
7 mandating inclusion of certain services; permitting
8 insurers to review treatment plans; providing certain
9 applications; requiring certain costs be borne by
10 insurer; providing certain exceptions; providing
11 definitions; directing certain agencies to conduct
12 certain examination; requiring certain report;
13 directing Oklahoma Health Care Authority to submit
14 certain documents under certain circumstances;
15 providing limitations; providing definitions;
16 amending 36 O.S. 2011, Section 6060.20, which relates
17 to mandated coverage; deleting certain construction;
18 providing exemptions under certain circumstances;
19 specifying certain calculation; providing guidelines
20 for issuance of exemptions; providing for
21 codification; and providing an effective date.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.21 of Title 36, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. For all plans issued or renewed on or after November 1,
2016, a health benefit plan and the Oklahoma Employees Health
Insurance Plan shall provide coverage for the screening, diagnosis
and treatment of autism spectrum disorder in individuals less than
nine (9) years of age, or if an individual is not diagnosed or
treated until after three (3) years of age, coverage shall be
provided for at least six (6) years, provided that the individual
continually and consistently shows sufficient progress and

1 improvement as determined by the health care provider. No insurer
2 shall terminate coverage, or refuse to deliver, execute, issue,
3 amend, adjust or renew coverage to an individual solely because the
4 individual is diagnosed with or has received treatment for an autism
5 spectrum disorder.

6 B. Except as provided in subsection E of this section, coverage
7 under this section shall not be subject to any limits on the number
8 of visits an individual may make for treatment of autism spectrum
9 disorder.

10 C. Coverage under this section shall not be subject to dollar
11 limits, deductibles or coinsurance provisions that are less
12 favorable to an insured than the dollar limits, deductibles or
13 coinsurance provisions that apply to substantially all medical and
14 surgical benefits under the health benefit plan, except as otherwise
15 provided in subsection E of this section.

16 D. This section shall not be construed as limiting benefits
17 that are otherwise available to an individual under a health benefit
18 plan.

19 E. Coverage for applied behavior analysis shall be subject to a
20 maximum benefit of twenty-five (25) hours per week and no more than
21 Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per year. Beginning
22 January 1, 2018, the Oklahoma Insurance Commissioner shall, on an
23 annual basis, adjust the maximum benefit for inflation by using the
24 Medical Care Component of the United States Department of Labor

1 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). The
2 Commissioner shall submit the adjusted maximum benefit for
3 publication annually before January 1, 2018, and before the first
4 day of January of each calendar year thereafter, and the published
5 adjusted maximum benefit shall be applicable in the following
6 calendar year to the Oklahoma Employees Health Insurance Plan and
7 health benefit plans subject to this section. Payments made by an
8 insurer on behalf of a covered individual for treatment other than
9 applied behavior analysis shall not be applied toward any maximum
10 benefit established under this section.

11 F. Coverage for applied behavior analysis shall include the
12 services of the board-certified behavior analyst or a licensed
13 doctoral-level psychologist.

14 G. Except for inpatient services, if an insured is receiving
15 treatment for an autism spectrum disorder, an insurer shall have the
16 right to review the treatment plan annually, unless the insurer and
17 the insured's treating physician or psychologist agree that a more
18 frequent review is necessary. Any such agreement regarding the
19 right to review a treatment plan more frequently shall apply only to
20 a particular insured being treated for an autism spectrum disorder
21 and shall not apply to all individuals being treated for autism
22 spectrum disorder by a physician or psychologist. The cost of
23 obtaining any review or treatment plan shall be borne by the
24 insurer.

1 H. This section shall not be construed as affecting any
2 obligation to provide services to an individual under an
3 individualized family service plan, an individualized education
4 program or an individualized service plan.

5 I. Nothing in this section shall apply to nongrandfathered
6 plans in the individual and small group markets that are required to
7 include essential health benefits under the federal Patient
8 Protection and Affordable Care Act, Public Law 111-148, or to
9 Medicare supplement, accident-only, specified disease, hospital
10 indemnity, disability income, long-term care or other limited
11 benefit hospital insurance policies.

12 J. As used in this section:

13 1. "Applied behavior analysis" means the design, implementation
14 and evaluation of environmental modifications, using behavioral
15 stimuli and consequences, to produce socially significant
16 improvement in human behavior, including the use of direct
17 observation, measurement and functional analysis of the relationship

20 developmental disorders or autism spectrum disorders as defined by
21 the most recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of
22 Mental Disorders (DSM) or the edition that was in effect at the time

2 programs, including applied behavior analysis, that are:

3 a. necessary to develop, maintain or restore, to the
4 maximum extent practicable, the functioning of an
5 individual, and

6 b. provided by a board-certified behavior analyst or by a
7 licensed doctoral-level psychologist so long as the
8 services performed are commensurate with the
9 psychologist's university training and experience;

10 4. "Diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder" means medically
11 necessary assessment, evaluations or tests to diagnose whether an
12 individual has an autism spectrum disorder;

13 5. "Health benefit plan" means any plan or arrangement as
14 defined in subsection C of Section 6060.4 of Title 36 of the
15 Oklahoma Statutes;

16 6. "Oklahoma Employees Health Insurance Plan" means "Health
17 Insurance Plan" as defined in Section 1303 of Title 74 of the
18 Oklahoma Statutes;

19 7. "Pharmacy care" means medications prescribed by a licensed
20 physician and any health-related services deemed medically necessary
21 to determine the need or effectiveness of the medications;

22 8. "Psychiatric care" means direct or consultative services
23 provided by a psychiatrist licensed in the state in which the
24 psychiatrist practices;

1 9. "Psychological care" means direct or consultative services
2 provided by a psychologist licensed in the state in which the
3 psychologist practices;

4 10. "Therapeutic care" means services provided by licensed or
5 certified speech therapists, occupational therapists or physical
6 therapists; and

7 11. "Treatment for autism spectrum disorder" means evidence-
8 based care and related equipment prescribed or ordered for an
9 individual diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder by a licensed
10 physician or a licensed doctoral-level psychologist who determines
11 the care to be medically necessary, including, but not limited to:

- 12 a. behavioral health treatment,
- 13 b. pharmacy care,
- 14 c. psychiatric care,
- 15 d. psychological care, and
- 16 e. therapeutic care.

17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1011.12 of Title 56, unless
19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority, in conjunction with the
21 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Service, the State
22 Department of Health and the State Department of Education shall
23 examine the feasibility of a state plan amendment to the Oklahoma
24

1 Medicaid Program for applied behavior analysis treatment of autism
2 spectrum disorders.

3 B. On or before December 31, 2016, the Authority and partnering
4 agencies shall submit a report to the President Pro Tempore of the
5 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Governor
6 estimating the potential costs to the state, clinical findings,
7 reviews of pilot projects and research from other states on the
8 effects of applied behavioral analysis treatment on autism spectrum
9 disorders.

10 C. Beginning July 1, 2017, and subject to the availability of
11 funding, the Authority and partnering agencies shall draft a state
12 plan amendment for applied behavior analysis treatment of autism
13 spectrum disorders. The provisions of this subsection shall only
14 apply if the report required by subsection B of this section
15 demonstrates applied behavioral analysis treatment to be evidence-
16 based and essential to qualifying participants in the Oklahoma
17 Medicaid Program.

18 D. As used in this section:

19 1. "Applied behavior analysis" means the design, implementation
20 and evaluation of environmental modifications, using behavioral
21 stimuli and consequences, to produce socially significant
22 improvement in human behavior, including the use of direct
23 observation, measurement and functional analysis of the relationship
24 between environment and behavior;

1 2. "Autism spectrum disorder" means any of the pervasive
2 developmental disorders or autism spectrum disorders as defined by
3 the most recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of
4 Mental Disorders (DSM) or the edition that was in effect at the time
5 of diagnosis;

6 3. "Behavioral health treatment" means counseling and treatment
7 programs, including applied behavior analysis, that are:

- 8 a. necessary to develop, maintain or restore, to the
9 maximum extent practicable, the functioning of an
10 individual, and
- 11 b. provided by a board-certified behavior analyst or by a
12 licensed doctoral-level psychologist so long as the
13 services performed are commensurate with the
14 psychologist's university training and supervised
15 experience; and

16 4. "Treatment for autism spectrum disorder" means evidence-
17 based care and related equipment prescribed or ordered for an
18 individual diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder by a licensed
19 physician or a licensed doctoral-level psychologist who determines
20 the care to be medically necessary, including, but not limited to:

- 21 a. behavioral health treatment,
- 22 b. pharmacy care,
- 23 c. psychiatric care,
- 24 d. psychological care, and

1 e. therapeutic care.

2 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 36 O.S. 2011, Section 6060.20, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 Section 6060.20 A. All individual and group health insurance
5 policies that provide medical and surgical benefits shall provide
6 the same coverage and benefits to any individual under the age of
7 eighteen (18) years who has been diagnosed with an autistic disorder
8 as it would provide coverage and benefits to an individual under the
9 age of eighteen (18) years who has not been diagnosed with an
10 autistic disorder.

11 B. As used in this section, "autistic disorder" means a
12 neurological disorder that is marked by severe impairment in social
13 interaction, communication, and imaginative ~~plan~~ play, with onset
14 during the first three (3) years of life and is included in a group
15 of disorders known as autism spectrum disorders.

16 ~~C. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require an~~
17 ~~insurer to provide any benefits for the diagnosis or treatment of~~
18 ~~any autistic disorder.~~

19 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.21 of Title 36, unless
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. 1. A health benefit plan that, at the end of its base
23 period, experiences a greater than one percent (1%) increase in
24 premium costs pursuant to providing applied behavior analysis for

1 treatment of autism spectrum disorders shall be exempt from the
2 provisions of this act.

3 2. To calculate base-period-premium costs, the health benefit
4 plan shall subtract from premium costs incurred during the base
5 period, both the premium costs incurred during the period
6 immediately preceding the base period and any premium cost increases
7 attributable to factors unrelated to benefits for treatment of
8 autism spectrum disorders.

9 3. a. To claim the exemption provided for in subsection A of
10 this section a health benefit plan shall provide to
11 the Insurance Commissioner a written request signed by
12 an actuary stating the reasons and actuarial
13 assumptions upon which the request is based.

14 b. The Commissioner shall verify the information provided
15 and shall approve or disapprove the request within
16 thirty (30) days of receipt.

17 c. If, upon investigation, the Commissioner finds that
18 any statement of fact in the request is found to be
19 knowingly false, the health benefit plan may be
20 subject to suspension or loss of license or any other
21 penalty as determined by the Commissioner, or the
22 State Commissioner of Health with regard to health
23 maintenance organizations.

24 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016."
