15 "SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 57 O.S. 2011, Section 509, as
16 amended by Section 245, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (57 O.S. Supp.
17 2015, Section 509), is amended to read as follows:

18 Section 509. The Oklahoma State Penitentiary shall be located
19 at McAlester in Pittsburg County, State of Oklahoma; and the
20 Oklahoma State Reformatory shall be located at Granite in Greer
21 County, State of Oklahoma; and the Lexington Assessment and
22 Reception Center shall be located at Lexington in Cleveland County,
23 State of Oklahoma; and the Jackie Brannon Correctional Center shall
24 be located at McAlester in Pittsburg County, State of Oklahoma; and
the Joseph Harp Correctional Center shall be located at Lexington in

12 Corrections Act of 1967, shall have the powers and duties vested by
13 law in the Office of Management and Enterprise Services in all
14 matters relating to penal institutions, heretofore or hereafter
15 established by the Department, which institutions and community
16 corrections centers shall be under the administrative direction and
17 control of the Department."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 57 O.S. 2011, Section 502, as
14 amended by Section 7, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2012 (57 O.S. Supp. 2015,
15 Section 502), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 502. As used in this title, unless the context
17 otherwise requires:

18 1. "Board" means the State Board of Corrections;

19 2. "Department" means the Department of Corrections of this
20 state;

21 3. "Director" means the Director of the Department of
22 Corrections;

23 4. "Halfway house" means a private facility for the placement
24 of inmates in a community setting for the purpose of reintegrating

1 into the community inmates who are nearing their release dates. The
2 term shall not include private prisons;

3 5. "Institutions" means the Oklahoma State Penitentiary located
4 at McAlester, Oklahoma; the Oklahoma State Reformatory located at
5 Granite, Oklahoma; the Lexington Assessment and Reception Center
6 located at Lexington, Oklahoma; the Joseph Harp Correctional Center
7 located at Lexington, Oklahoma; the Jackie Brannon Correctional
8 Center located at McAlester, Oklahoma; the Howard C. McLeod
9 Correctional Center located at Farris, Oklahoma; the Mack H. Alford
10 Correctional Center located at Stringtown, Oklahoma; the Jim E.
11 Hamilton Correctional Center located at Hodgen, Oklahoma; the Mabel
12 Bassett Correctional Center located at ~~Oklahoma City~~ McLoud,
13 Oklahoma; the R.B. "Dick" Conner Correctional Center located at
14 Hominy, Oklahoma; the James Crabtree Correctional Center located at
15 Helena, Oklahoma; the Jess Dunn Correctional Center located at Taft,
16 Oklahoma; the John Lilley Correctional Center located at Boley,
17 Oklahoma; the William S. Key Correctional Center located at Fort
18 Supply, Oklahoma; the Dr. Eddie Walter Warrior Correctional Center
19 located at Taft, Oklahoma; the Northeast Oklahoma Correctional
20 Center located at Vinita, Oklahoma; the Clara Waters and Kate
21 Barnard Community Corrections Centers located at Oklahoma City,
22 Oklahoma; the Community Corrections Centers located at Lawton, Enid,
23 Oklahoma City and ~~Muskogee~~ Union City; the Charles E. "Bill" Johnson
24 Correctional Center, located east of Alva, Oklahoma; the Southern

1 Oklahoma Resource Center located at Pauls Valley, Oklahoma; and
2 other facilities under the jurisdiction and control of the
3 Department of Corrections or hereafter established by the Department
4 of Corrections;

5 6. "Intermediate revocation facility" means a corrections
6 center operated by the Department of Corrections or a private
7 facility or public trust operating pursuant to contract with the
8 Department of Corrections which provides housing and intensive
9 programmatic services for offenders who have violated the terms or
10 conditions of probation as determined by a supervising probation
11 officer. "Intensive programmatic services" offered by the
12 Department of Corrections includes, but shall not be limited to,
13 alcohol and substance abuse counseling and treatment, mental health
14 counseling and treatment and domestic violence courses and treatment
15 programs;

16 7. "Intermediate sanctions facility" means a community
17 corrections center operated by the Department of Corrections or a
18 private facility or public trust operating pursuant to contract with
19 the Department of Corrections which provides for the housing and
20 programmatic services of offenders such as probation or parole
21 violators or community sentenced offenders placed in the facility
22 for disciplinary sanctions, work release offenders, offenders who
23 need intensive programmatic services, or offenders who have
24 demonstrated positive adjustment while in an institutional setting

1 who need additional programmatic services to enhance their reentry
2 into society upon release from a prison term; and

3 8. "Private prison contractor" means:

- 4 a. a nongovernmental entity or public trust which,
5 pursuant to a contract with the Department of
6 Corrections, operates an institution within the
7 Department other than a halfway house or intermediate
8 sanctions facility, or provides for the housing, care,
9 and control of inmates and performs other functions
10 related to these responsibilities within a minimum,
11 medium, or maximum security level facility not owned
12 by the Department but operated by the contractor, or
- 13 b. a nongovernmental entity or public trust which,
14 pursuant to a contract with the United States or
15 another state, provides for the housing, care, and
16 control of minimum or medium security inmates in the
17 custody of the United States or another state, and
18 performs other functions related to these
19 responsibilities other than a halfway house or
20 intermediate sanctions facility within a facility
21 owned or operated by the contractor.

22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
