8 PROPOSED COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

9 An Act relating to public health; requiring health
10 care facilities to include certain breast density
11 information in a mammography report; requiring notice
12 under certain circumstances; providing that certain
13 information may be provided to patient; providing
14 that no duty of care exists; providing that notice
15 shall not be inconsistent with federal law; providing
16 for codification; and providing an effective date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-553.1 of Title 63, unless
20 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 A. All health care facilities that perform mammography
22 examinations shall include in the summary of the mammography report,
23 required by federal law to be provided to a patient, information
24 that identifies the patient's individual breast density
classification based on the Breast Imaging Reporting and Data System

1 established by the American College of Radiology. If the facility
2 determines that a patient has heterogeneously or extremely dense
3 breast tissue, the summary of the mammography report shall include
4 the following notice:

5 "Your mammogram indicates that you have dense breast tissue.
6 Dense breast tissue is common and is found in more than fifty
7 percent (50%) of women and is not abnormal. However, dense breast
8 tissue may make it more difficult to detect breast cancer and may be
9 associated with an increased risk of breast cancer. This
10 information is being provided to raise your awareness and to
11 encourage you and your health care provider to discuss this and
12 other breast cancer risk factors. Together, you and your health
13 care provider can decide if additional screening options may be
14 right for you. A report of your results was sent to your health
15 care provider."

16 B. Patients who receive diagnostic or screening mammograms may
17 be directed to informative material about breast density. This
18 informative material may include the American College of Radiology's
19 most current brochure on the subject of breast density available on
20 the American College of Radiology's website. Patients and health
21 care providers can be further informed by material from the American
22 Cancer Society or Mammography Saves Lives organizations.

23 C. Nothing in this section shall be deemed to create a duty of
24 care or other legal obligation beyond the duty to provide notice as

1 set forth in subsection A of this section. Nothing in this section
2 shall be deemed to require a notice that is inconsistent with the
3 provisions of the federal Mammography Quality Standards Act or any
4 regulations promulgated pursuant thereto.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
