10 An Act relating to institutions of the Department of
11 Corrections; amending 57 O.S. 2011, Section 502, as
12 amended by Section 7, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2012 (57
13 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section 502), which relates to
14 definitions; amending inclusions; and providing an
15 effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 57 O.S. 2011, Section 502, as
18 amended by Section 7, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2012 (57 O.S. Supp. 2015,
19 Section 502), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 502. As used in this title, unless the context
21 otherwise requires:

- 22 1. "Board" means the State Board of Corrections;
- 23 2. "Department" means the Department of Corrections of this
24 state;

1 3. "Director" means the Director of the Department of
2 Corrections;

3 4. "Halfway house" means a private facility for the placement
4 of inmates in a community setting for the purpose of reintegrating
5 into the community inmates who are nearing their release dates. The
6 term shall not include private prisons;

7 5. "Institutions" means the Oklahoma State Penitentiary located
8 at McAlester, Oklahoma; the Oklahoma State Reformatory located at
9 Granite, Oklahoma; the Lexington Assessment and Reception Center
10 located at Lexington, Oklahoma; the Joseph Harp Correctional Center
11 located at Lexington, Oklahoma; the Jackie Brannon Correctional
12 Center located at McAlester, Oklahoma; the Howard C. McLeod
13 Correctional Center located at Farris, Oklahoma; the Mack H. Alford
14 Correctional Center located at Stringtown, Oklahoma; the Jim E.
15 Hamilton Correctional Center located at Hodgen, Oklahoma; the Mabel
16 Bassett Correctional Center located at ~~Oklahoma City~~ McLoud,
17 Oklahoma; the R.B. "Dick" Conner Correctional Center located at
18 Hominy, Oklahoma; the James Crabtree Correctional Center located at
19 Helena, Oklahoma; the Jess Dunn Correctional Center located at Taft,
20 Oklahoma; the John Lilley Correctional Center located at Boley,
21 Oklahoma; the William S. Key Correctional Center located at Fort
22 Supply, Oklahoma; the Dr. Eddie Walter Warrior Correctional Center
23 located at Taft, Oklahoma; the Northeast Oklahoma Correctional
24 Center located at Vinita, Oklahoma; the Clara Waters and Kate

1 Barnard Community Corrections Centers located at Oklahoma City,
2 Oklahoma; the Community Corrections Centers located at Lawton, Enid,
3 Oklahoma City and ~~Muskege~~ Union City; the Charles E. "Bill" Johnson
4 Correctional Center, located east of Alva, Oklahoma; the Southern
5 Oklahoma Resource Center located at Pauls Valley, Oklahoma; and
6 other facilities under the jurisdiction and control of the
7 Department of Corrections or hereafter established by the Department
8 of Corrections;

9 6. "Intermediate revocation facility" means a corrections
10 center operated by the Department of Corrections or a private
11 facility or public trust operating pursuant to contract with the
12 Department of Corrections which provides housing and intensive
13 programmatic services for offenders who have violated the terms or
14 conditions of probation as determined by a supervising probation
15 officer. "Intensive programmatic services" offered by the
16 Department of Corrections includes, but shall not be limited to,
17 alcohol and substance abuse counseling and treatment, mental health
18 counseling and treatment and domestic violence courses and treatment
19 programs;

20 7. "Intermediate sanctions facility" means a community
21 corrections center operated by the Department of Corrections or a
22 private facility or public trust operating pursuant to contract with
23 the Department of Corrections which provides for the housing and
24 programmatic services of offenders such as probation or parole

1 violators or community sentenced offenders placed in the facility
2 for disciplinary sanctions, work release offenders, offenders who
3 need intensive programmatic services, or offenders who have
4 demonstrated positive adjustment while in an institutional setting
5 who need additional programmatic services to enhance their reentry
6 into society upon release from a prison term; and

7 8. "Private prison contractor" means:

- 8 a. a nongovernmental entity or public trust which,
9 pursuant to a contract with the Department of
10 Corrections, operates an institution within the
11 Department other than a halfway house or intermediate
12 sanctions facility, or provides for the housing, care,
13 and control of inmates and performs other functions
14 related to these responsibilities within a minimum,
15 medium, or maximum security level facility not owned
16 by the Department but operated by the contractor, or
- 17 b. a nongovernmental entity or public trust which,
18 pursuant to a contract with the United States or
19 another state, provides for the housing, care, and
20 control of minimum or medium security inmates in the
21 custody of the United States or another state, and
22 performs other functions related to these
23 responsibilities other than a halfway house or

1 intermediate sanctions facility within a facility
2 owned or operated by the contractor.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
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
