11 An Act relating to the Oklahoma Highway Patrol;
12 amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 2-150, which relates
13 to retention of property after retirement; modifying
14 cost to be paid; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section
15 150.23, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 319, O.S.L.
16 2014 (74 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 150.23), which
17 relates to the possession of badges and sidearms upon
18 retirement; authorizing agents of the Oklahoma State
19 Bureau of Investigation to purchase rifle or shotgun
20 upon retirement; and providing an effective date.

24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 2-150, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 2-150. A. A commissioned officer of the Oklahoma
Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be
entitled to receive upon retirement, by reason of length of service
or physical disability, the continued custody and possession of the

1 sidearm and badge carried by the retired officer immediately prior
2 to retirement. In addition to the sidearm carried by the retired
3 officer immediately prior to retirement, the retired officer may
4 purchase the rifle or shotgun, or both, issued to the retired
5 officer immediately prior to retirement. The cost to the retired
6 officer of purchasing the weapon or weapons shall be the ~~replacement~~
7 ~~cost for a new weapon or weapons~~ price the Department paid at the
8 time of purchase, and upon payment of that price, the retired
9 officer shall be entitled to ownership of the weapon or weapons.
10 Any records regarding the ownership of each weapon transferred shall
11 be modified to reflect the transfer to the retired officer.
12 Proceeds from the purchase of the weapon or weapons shall be
13 deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund.

14 B. A commissioned officer of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol
15 Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be entitled to
16 receive, upon retirement, the continued custody and possession of
17 the official license plate issued for the vehicle that was assigned
18 to the retired officer immediately prior to retirement, provided the
19 license plate shall not be placed on any motor vehicle. The
20 provisions of this subsection shall apply to any officer retiring on
21 or after April 1, 1993, if the official license plate is available.

22 C. Custody and possession of the sidearm, one complete uniform,
23 badge and official license plate of a commissioned officer of the
24 Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety

1 who dies during his or her appointment may be awarded by the
2 Commissioner to the spouse or next-of-kin of the deceased officer,
3 provided the license plate shall not be placed on any motor vehicle.

4 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.23, as
5 amended by Section 1, Chapter 319, O.S.L. 2014 (74 O.S. Supp. 2014,
6 Section 150.23), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 150.23 A. An officer, investigator, or agent of the
8 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Oklahoma State Bureau of
9 Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control, the Department of Wildlife
10 Conservation, the Law Enforcement Division of the Oklahoma Horse
11 Racing Commission, the State Fire Marshal's Office, the Oklahoma
12 Tourism and Recreation Department, the Office of Inspector General
13 and the Oklahoma Child Support Services divisions of the Department
14 of Human Services or the office of a district attorney shall be
15 entitled to receive, upon retirement by reason of length of service,
16 the continued custody and possession of the sidearm and badge
17 carried by such officer, investigator, or agent immediately prior to
18 retirement.

19 B. An officer, investigator, or agent specified in subsection A
20 of this section may be entitled to receive, upon retirement by
21 reason of disability, the continued custody and possession of the
22 sidearm and badge carried by such officer or agent immediately prior
23 to retirement upon written approval of the applicable Director of
24

1 the appropriate Bureau, Department, Commission, or district
2 attorney.

3 C. Custody and possession of the sidearm and badge of an
4 officer, investigator, or agent who dies while employed by any
5 Bureau, Department, Commission, or office specified in subsection A
6 of this section may be awarded by the applicable Director of the
7 appropriate Bureau, Department, Commission, or office to the spouse
8 or next of kin of the deceased officer, investigator, or agent.

9 D. A correctional officer, a probation and parole officer or an
10 internal affairs agent of the Oklahoma Department of Corrections
11 shall be entitled to receive, upon retirement by reason of length of
12 service, the continued custody and possession of the badge carried
13 by such officer immediately prior to retirement.

14 E. In addition to the sidearm carried by a retired agent of the
15 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the retired agent may
16 purchase the rifle or shotgun, or both, issued to the retired agent
17 immediately prior to retirement. The cost to the retired agent of
18 purchasing the rifle or shotgun, or both, shall be the price the
19 Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation paid at the time of purchase,
20 and upon payment of that price, the retired agent shall be entitled
21 to ownership of the rifle or shotgun, or both.

22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
