8 An Act relating to mental health; amending 43A O.S.
9 2011, Section 3-417.1, which prohibits certain
10 facilities from being located within certain distance
11 from certain schools; removing certain facility from
12 such prohibition; and providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 43A O.S. 2011, Section 3-417.1, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Section 3-417.1 Any ~~private treatment facility,~~ transitional
17 living center or halfway house, as defined in Section 3-403 of this
18 title, shall be subject to the nondiscriminatory zoning laws of the
19 state, county or municipality in which located, and the location of
20 such facility is specifically prohibited within one thousand (1,000)
21 feet of any public or private elementary or secondary school.

22 Provided, that if any public or private elementary or secondary
23 school shall be established within the prohibited distance from any
24 such facility after such facility has been in use as a ~~treatment~~

1 ~~facility,~~ transitional living center or halfway house, this shall
2 not be a bar to the continued use of the facility as designated so
3 long as it remains in continuous use as designated. The distance
4 indicated in this section shall be measured from the nearest
5 property line of the school to the nearest property line of the
6 ~~treatment facility,~~ transitional living center or halfway house.
7 The provisions of this section shall not apply to any ~~treatment~~
8 ~~facility,~~ transitional living center or halfway house established
9 prior to the effective date of this act.

10 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
