An Act relating to elections; creating the Military Privacy Protection Act; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Section 4-115.2, which relates to address confidentiality; adding military to protected class status; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

SUBJECT: Address confidentiality of registered voters who are members of certain classes

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Military Privacy Protection Act".

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 4-115.2, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4-115.2 The Secretary of the State Election Board is authorized to promulgate rules to keep confidential the residence and mailing address, upon application to do so, of individual registered voters who are members of certain classes. These classes shall be limited to the judiciary, district attorneys, assistant district attorneys, Uniformed Services members, law enforcement personnel, correctional officers, persons who are protected by victim's protection orders, the spouses and dependents of the members of such classes, and persons who are certified by the

Secretary of State as participants in the Address Confidentiality Program established by Section 60.14 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such address information shall be provided to a candidate or candidate representative or other lawful authority in anticipation or as part of a contest of candidacy or contest of an election as provided for in Title 26 of the Oklahoma Statutes or as part of a petition challenge as provided by law. However, no information concerning the address of a certified Address Confidentiality Program participant shall be released by election officials to any person for any purpose except under court order.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.
