Page 31, Line 1 through Page 32, Line 9, by deleting Section 8 and inserting in a new Section 8 to read as per the attached.

Page 64, Line 3 1/2, by inserting a new Section 21 to read: "Section 8 of this act shall become effective April 30, 2016"; and renumber subsequent section;

Page 64, Line 4, by deleting the effective date and inserting the words, "Sections 1 through 7 and Sections 9 through 20 of this act shall become effective November 1, 2015"; and

"SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-503.1 of Title 40, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

FILING OF EMPLOYER PROTEST AND DOCUMENTS THROUGH EMPLOYER PORTAL.

Secondary Amendment

1 A. The procedure set out in this section for the filing of a
2 statement of objection by telefax or email is an optional procedure
3 for the employer. If the employer chooses not to utilize this
4 procedure, the employer must file its protest in accordance with
5 subsection E of Section 2-503 of Title 40 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

6 B. An employer may file a statement of objections to the claim
7 of a former employee at any time from the moment of discharge or
8 separation from employment of the employee until the expiration of
9 the ten-day time period set out in subsection E of Section 2-503 of
10 Title 40 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The statement of objection must
11 be filed through the employer portal on the Oklahoma Employment
12 Security Commission's Internet website and must contain a statement
13 of specific facts and documentation which:

- 14 1. Disclose the name and social security number of the employee;
- 15 2. Make the claimant ineligible for benefits under Sections 2-
16 201 through 2-210 of Title 40 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 17 3. Disqualify the claimant for benefits under Sections 2-401
18 through 2-419 of Title 40 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or
- 19 4. Relieve the employer from being charged for the benefits
20 wages of this claimant.

21 C. Any statement of objection filed pursuant to this section
22 within the time period and in the manner set out in subsection B of
23 this section shall be considered a valid protest to a claim for
24 unemployment benefits filed by the former employee and the employer
shall be considered an interested party to the claim. A statement of

1 objection filed pursuant to this section outside the time period or
2 in any manner other than as set out in subsection B of this section
3 shall not be considered a valid protest to a claim for unemployment
4 of the former employee, and the employer shall not be considered an
5 interested party to the claim."

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
