3 B. If disclosure would give an unfair advantage to competitors  
4 or bidders, a public body may keep confidential records relating to:

5 1. Bid specifications for competitive bidding prior to  
6 publication by the public body; or

7 2. Contents of sealed bids prior to the opening of bids by a  
8 public body; or

9 3. Computer programs or software but not data thereon; or

10 4. Appraisals relating to the sale or acquisition of real  
11 estate by a public body prior to award of a contract; or

12 5. The prospective location of a private business or industry  
13 prior to public disclosure of such prospect except for records  
14 otherwise open to inspection such as applications for permits or  
15 licenses.

16 C. Except as set forth hereafter, the Oklahoma Department of  
17 Commerce, the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology  
18 Education, the technology center school districts, ~~and~~ the Oklahoma  
19 Film and Music Office, and institutions within the Oklahoma State  
20 System of Higher Education may keep confidential:

21 1. Business plans, feasibility studies, financing proposals,  
22 marketing plans, financial statements or trade secrets submitted by  
23 a person or entity seeking economic advice, business development or  
24 customized training from such Departments or school districts;

1           2. Proprietary information of the business submitted to the  
2 Department or school districts for the purpose of business  
3 development or customized training, and related confidentiality  
4 agreements detailing the information or records designated as  
5 confidential; and

6           3. Information compiled by such Departments or school districts  
7 in response to those submissions.

8           The Oklahoma Department of Commerce, the Oklahoma Department of  
9 Career and Technology Education, the technology center school  
10 districts, ~~and~~ the Oklahoma Film and Music Office, and institutions  
11 within the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education may not keep  
12 confidential that submitted information when and to the extent the  
13 person or entity submitting the information consents to disclosure.

14           D. Although they must provide public access to their records,  
15 including records of the address, rate paid for services, charges,  
16 consumption rates, adjustments to the bill, reasons for adjustment,  
17 the name of the person that authorized the adjustment, and payment  
18 for each customer, public bodies that provide utility services to  
19 the public may keep confidential credit information, credit card  
20 numbers, telephone numbers, social security numbers, bank account  
21 information for individual customers, and utility supply and utility  
22 equipment supply contracts for any industrial customer with a  
23 connected electric load in excess of two thousand five hundred  
24 (2,500) kilowatts if public access to such contracts would give an

1 unfair advantage to competitors of the customer; provided that,  
2 where a public body performs billing or collection services for a  
3 utility regulated by the Corporation Commission pursuant to a  
4 contractual agreement, any customer or individual payment data  
5 obtained or created by the public body in performance of the  
6 agreement shall not be a record for purposes of this act.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
