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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to children; amending 10 O.S. 2011,
8 Section 601.12, which relates to community
9 partnership boards; permitting board to be considered
10 board within Oklahoma Commission on Children and
11 Youth; providing limited applicability to The
12 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act for certain board
13 purchase; directing Commission to provide assistance
14 and promulgate rules; authorizing distribution by
15 nonprofit organizations; requiring item to be
16 purchased at cost; allowing Commission to charge fee;
17 setting maximum amount of fee; and providing an
18 effective date.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

20 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10 O.S. 2011, Section 601.12, is
21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 601.12 A. Each community partnership board shall, with
23 the assistance of the Office of Planning and Coordination for
24 Services to Children and Youth, prepare and implement a community
plan for children and youth services and for the development and
coordination of such services within the community. The community
plans shall be transmitted to the Office of Planning and

1 Coordination. Systemic issues shall be collected annually and
2 submitted to the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth for use
3 in the preparation of the State Plan for Services to Children and
4 Youth.

5 B. Each community partnership board shall develop a written
6 statement clearly identifying its operating procedures, purpose,
7 overall responsibilities and method of meeting those
8 responsibilities.

9 C. The community plan shall address the needs of children,
10 youth and families as they relate to education, health, mental
11 health, economic security, safety and human services issues, and
12 shall contain:

13 1. Identified goals, intended outcomes, and priorities for
14 serving children and families;

15 2. A description of specific needs to be addressed by the plan,
16 as well as services and other support available through public,
17 private, and community-based organizations;

18 3. A description of the resources needed to implement the local
19 plan;

20 4. Recommendations for proposed policy or program changes and
21 alternative funding strategies for meeting identified needs;

22 5. An implementation strategy and time line; and

23 6. A description of the resources, types of assistance or
24 training needed to implement the plan.

1 D. If the community plan includes a need for providing diapers
2 for children from birth to age three (3) of indigent families within
3 the community, the community partnership board may be considered a
4 board within the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth as
5 referred to in Section 85.2 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes
6 defining state agency within The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act,
7 only for the purpose of purchasing the diapers on behalf of the
8 state and distributing them at no cost to the state.

9 E. The Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth shall provide
10 technical assistance to the community partnership boards and shall
11 promulgate rules and regulations providing qualifications for
12 indigent families and for the distribution of diapers at no cost to
13 the families. The items may be distributed through nonprofit
14 organizations that shall purchase the items at cost. The Oklahoma
15 Commission on Children and Youth may charge the boards an
16 administrative fee not to exceed three percent (3%).

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.

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
