6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011,
8 Section 1210.508, as last amended by Section 8,
9 Chapter 430, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section
10 1210.508), which relates to the Oklahoma School
11 Testing Program Act; changing the testing window
12 dates for certain criterion-referenced tests;
13 clarifying statutory language; providing an effective
14 date; and declaring an emergency.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.508, as
17 last amended by Section 8, Chapter 430, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp.
18 2015, Section 1210.508), is amended to read as follows:

19 Section 1210.508 A. 1. The State Board of Education shall
20 develop and administer a series of criterion-referenced tests
21 designed to indicate whether the subject matter standards, as
22 defined by the State Board of Education, which Oklahoma public
23 school students are expected to have attained have been achieved.
24 The Board may develop and administer any criterion-referenced test
in any subject not required by federal law, contingent upon the

1 availability of funding. Students who do not perform at least at
2 the proficient level on tests shall be remediated, subject to the
3 availability of funding.

4 2. Contingent upon the availability of state and federal funds,
5 the Board, in accordance with federal law, shall administer
6 criterion-referenced tests for grades three and four in:

- 7 a. reading, and
- 8 b. mathematics.

9 3. Contingent upon the availability of funds, the Board shall
10 administer criterion-referenced tests for grade five in:

- 11 a. reading,
- 12 b. mathematics,
- 13 c. science,
- 14 d. social studies, which shall consist of the history,
15 Constitution and government of the United States, and
16 geography, and
- 17 e. writing of English.

18 4. Contingent upon the availability of state and federal funds,
19 the Board, in accordance with federal law, shall administer
20 criterion-referenced tests for grades six and seven in:

- 21 a. reading, and
- 22 b. mathematics.

23 In addition, the Board shall administer a criterion-referenced
24 test in geography in grade seven.

1 5. Contingent upon the availability of funds, the Board shall
2 administer criterion-referenced tests for grade eight in:

- 3 a. reading,
- 4 b. mathematics,
- 5 c. science,
- 6 d. social studies, which shall consist of the history,
7 Constitution, and government of the United States, and
- 8 e. writing of English.

9 The Board shall administer the tests for grade eight in reading
10 and mathematics online with raw score test results reported
11 immediately and complete results reported in less than two (2) weeks
12 beginning in the 2007-08 school year.

13 6. Except as otherwise provided for in Section 1210.523 of this
14 title, each student who completes the instruction for English II,
15 English III, United States History, Biology I, Algebra I, Geometry,
16 and Algebra II at the secondary level shall complete an end-of-
17 instruction test, when implemented, to measure for attainment in the
18 appropriate subject matter standards in order to graduate from a
19 public high school with a standard diploma. All students shall take
20 the tests prior to graduation, unless otherwise exempt by law. The
21 State Board of Education shall administer the criterion-referenced
22 tests. The Board shall develop and field test the end-of-
23 instruction tests in English III, Geometry, and Algebra II during
24 the 2006-07 school year, implement the tests during the 2007-08

1 school year, and administer them each year thereafter. The Board
2 shall administer the multiple choice portion of the end-of-
3 instruction tests online with raw score test results reported
4 immediately and complete results reported in less than two (2) weeks
5 beginning in the 2008-09 school year.

6 The end-of-instruction tests shall serve the purpose of the
7 criterion-referenced tests as provided in paragraph 1 of this
8 subsection. The English II and English III end-of-instruction tests
9 shall include a writing component. Students who do not score at
10 least at the proficient level shall be afforded the opportunity to
11 retake each test up to three (3) times each calendar year until at
12 least achieving at the proficient level. In order to provide an
13 indication of the levels of competency attained by the student in a
14 permanent record for potential future employers and institutions of
15 higher education, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior
16 to the 2007-08 school year, school districts shall report the
17 highest-achieved state test performance level on the end-of-
18 instruction tests on the student's high school transcript.

19 Beginning with students who enter the ninth grade in the 2008-09
20 school year, school districts shall report the highest-achieved
21 state test performance level on the end-of-instruction tests and any
22 business and industry-recognized endorsements attained on the
23 student's high school transcript. Any student at the middle school
24 level who completes the instruction in a secondary course specified

1 in this paragraph shall be administered the appropriate end-of-
2 instruction test.

3 7. a. Each school district shall administer to each student
4 in the school district in grades three through eight
5 an assessment designed to assess the student in the
6 fine arts area in which the student has received
7 instruction.

8 b. Each school district shall prepare an annual report
9 for approval by the State Board of Education outlining
10 the fine arts assessment strategies used by the
11 district, when the assessments were administered, how
12 many students were assessed during the previous year,
13 and the results of the assessments.

14 B. 1. All criterion-referenced tests required by this section
15 shall measure academic competencies in correlation with the subject
16 matter standards adopted by the Board pursuant to Sections 11-103.6
17 and 11-103.6a of this title. The State Board of Education shall
18 evaluate the subject matter standards to ensure the competencies
19 reflect high standards, are specific, well-defined, measurable,
20 challenging, and will prepare elementary students for next-grade-
21 level course work and secondary students for postsecondary studies
22 at institutions of higher education or technology center schools
23 without the need for remediation. All subject matter standards
24

1 shall reflect the goals as set forth in Section 11-103.6 of this
2 title and of improving the state average ACT score.

3 2. The State Department of Education shall annually evaluate
4 the results of the criterion-referenced tests. The State Board of
5 Education shall ensure that test results are reported to districts
6 in a manner that yields detailed, diagnostic information for the
7 purpose of guiding instruction and student remediation. As
8 improvements are made to the criterion-referenced tests required by
9 this section, the Board shall seek to increase the depth of
10 knowledge assessed for each subject. The State Board of Education
11 shall seek to ensure that data yielded from the tests required in
12 this section are utilized at the school district level to prescribe
13 reinforcement and/or remediation by requiring school districts to
14 develop and implement a specific program of improvement based on the
15 test results.

16 3. The State Board of Education in coordination with the Office
17 of Educational Quality and Accountability shall review, realign, and
18 recalibrate, as necessary, the tests in reading and mathematics in
19 third through eighth grade and the end-of-instruction tests. The
20 Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability shall
21 determine the cut scores for the performance levels on the end-of-
22 instruction tests developed pursuant to paragraph 6 of subsection A
23 of this section. The Commission shall conduct an ongoing review to
24 compare the end-of-instruction test content and performance

1 descriptors with those of other states. Upon receipt of the review,
2 the Commission may adjust the cut scores as necessary.

3 4. The State Board of Education, for the purposes of conducting
4 reliability and validity studies, monitoring contractor adherence to
5 professionally accepted testing standards, and providing
6 recommendations for testing program improvement, shall retain the
7 services of an established, independent agency or organization that
8 is nationally recognized for its technical expertise in educational
9 testing but is not engaged in the development of aptitude or
10 achievement tests for elementary or secondary level grades. These
11 national assessment experts shall annually conduct studies of the
12 reliability and validity of the end-of-instruction tests
13 administered pursuant to this section. Validity studies shall
14 include studies of decision validity and concurrent validity.

15 C. 1. The State Board of Education shall set the testing
16 window dates for each criterion-referenced test required in
17 paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this section for grades
18 three through eight so that, with the exception of the writing
19 assessments, the tests are administered to students ~~no earlier than~~
20 ~~April 10~~ within a four-week period prior to the third Friday in May
21 ~~each year and so that the.~~ The test results ~~are~~ shall be reported
22 back to school districts in a timely manner. Each criterion-
23 referenced test required in paragraph 6 of subsection A of this
24 section may be administered to students at a time set by the State

1 Board of Education ~~as near as possible to~~ so that the tests are
2 administered within a four-week period prior to the end of the
3 course; ~~provided, if.~~ If a school district is unable to administer
4 the tests online to all students taking the test for the first time
5 and all students retaking the test during the testing window time
6 set by the Board, the school district may elect to administer any of
7 the tests to students retaking the test at any time not more than
8 two (2) weeks prior to the start of the testing window time set by
9 the Board. All results and reports of the criterion-referenced test
10 series required in paragraphs 1 through 5 of subsection A of this
11 section for grades three through eight shall be returned to each
12 school district prior to the beginning of the next school year. The
13 vendor shall provide a final electronic data file of all school
14 site, school district, and state results to the State Department of
15 Education and the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability
16 prior to September 1 of each year. The Department shall forward the
17 final data files for each school district and each school site in
18 that district to the school district. The Board shall ensure the
19 contract with the testing vendor includes a provision that the
20 vendor report test results directly to the Office of Educational
21 Quality and Accountability at the same time it is reported to the
22 Board.

23 2. State, district, and site level results of all tests
24 required in this section shall be disaggregated by gender, race,

1 ethnicity, disability status, migrant status, English proficiency,
2 and status as economically disadvantaged, except that such
3 disaggregation shall not be required in a case in which the number
4 of students in a category is insufficient to yield statistically
5 reliable information or the results would reveal personally
6 identifiable information about an individual student. Each school
7 site shall notify the student's parents of the school's performance
8 levels in the Oklahoma School Testing Program as reported in the
9 Oklahoma Educational Indicators Program at the end of each school
10 year.

11 D. The State Board of Education shall be responsible for the
12 development, field-testing, and validation of the criterion-
13 referenced test series required in subsection A of this section. In
14 the interest of economy the Board may participate in a multistate or
15 multigovernmental cooperative pursuant to the requirements of The
16 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, but shall not bind the state,
17 contractually or otherwise, to the authority of any other state,
18 organization or entity which may supersede the authority of the
19 Board, for the purpose of adapting criterion-referenced tests, to
20 the extent that such tests are appropriate for use in the testing
21 program to be administered to Oklahoma students.

22 E. The State Board of Education shall develop, administer, and
23 incorporate as a part of the Oklahoma School Testing Program, other
24 testing programs or procedures, including appropriate accommodations

1 for the testing of students with disabilities as required by the
2 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), 20 USC, Section
3 1400 et seq.

4 F. For purposes of developing and administering alternate
5 assessments for students with the most significant cognitive
6 disabilities, the State Board of Education shall not be subject to
7 subsections D and E of Section 11-103.6a of this title.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016.

9 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
10 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
11 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
12 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
