6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to Oklahoma Highway Patrol; amending  
8 47 O.S. 2011, Section 2-150, which relates to  
9 retention of property after retirement; modifying  
10 cost to be paid; and providing an effective date.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2011, Section 2-150, is  
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 2-150. A. A commissioned officer of the Oklahoma  
15 Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be  
16 entitled to receive upon retirement, by reason of length of service  
17 or physical disability, the continued custody and possession of the  
18 sidearm and badge carried by the retired officer immediately prior  
19 to retirement. In addition to the sidearm carried by the retired  
20 officer immediately prior to retirement, the retired officer may  
21 purchase the rifle or shotgun, or both, issued to the retired  
22 officer immediately prior to retirement. The cost to the retired  
23 officer of purchasing the weapon or weapons shall be the ~~replacement~~  
24 ~~cost for a new weapon or weapons~~ price the Department paid at the

1 time of purchase, and upon payment of that price, the retired  
2 officer shall be entitled to ownership of the weapon or weapons.  
3 Any records regarding the ownership of each weapon transferred shall  
4 be modified to reflect the transfer to the retired officer.  
5 Proceeds from the purchase of the weapon or weapons shall be  
6 deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund.

7 B. A commissioned officer of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol  
8 Division of the Department of Public Safety shall be entitled to  
9 receive, upon retirement, the continued custody and possession of  
10 the official license plate issued for the vehicle that was assigned  
11 to the retired officer immediately prior to retirement, provided the  
12 license plate shall not be placed on any motor vehicle. The  
13 provisions of this subsection shall apply to any officer retiring on  
14 or after April 1, 1993, if the official license plate is available.

15 C. Custody and possession of the sidearm, one complete uniform,  
16 badge and official license plate of a commissioned officer of the  
17 Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety  
18 who dies during his or her appointment may be awarded by the  
19 Commissioner to the spouse or next-of-kin of the deceased officer,  
20 provided the license plate shall not be placed on any motor vehicle.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
