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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to diabetes prevention; directing
8 Oklahoma Health Care Authority and State Department
9 of Health to collaborate for development and
10 submission of certain report; providing standards for
11 report; providing for certain limitation; providing
for codification; and providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7301 of Title 63, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the State Department
17 of Health shall collaborate to identify benchmarks and develop goals
18 to reduce the incidence rates of, improve health care services for,
19 and control complications resulting from diabetes.

20 B. The Authority and the Department shall submit a report to
21 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
22 of Representatives by January 10th of odd-numbered years. Such
23 report shall contain the following information:
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1 1. The fiscal impact of all types of diabetes on the Authority,
2 the Department, and county health departments, including the number
3 of persons with diabetes receiving services through the Authority,
4 the Department, and county health departments;

5 2. The fiscal impact of diabetes on the Authority, the
6 Department, and county health departments in comparison to other
7 chronic diseases;

8 3. An assessment of the benefits of diabetes prevention
9 programs including a summary of funding directed to the Authority
10 and the Department from the Oklahoma State Legislature;

11 4. A description of coordination between the Authority and the
12 Department including, but not limited to, programs relating to the
13 treatment and prevention of all forms of diabetes;

14 5. Detailed action plans for battling diabetes with actionable
15 items for consideration by the Legislature including, but not
16 limited to, steps to reduce the impact of diabetes, pre-diabetes,
17 and related diabetes complications;

18 6. Identification of expected outcomes of the action steps and
19 benchmarks for controlling and preventing all forms of diabetes; and

20 7. The development of a detailed budget blueprint identifying
21 needs, costs, and resources required to implement the plan provided
22 for in this act. Such blueprint shall include a budget range for
23 all options presented in the plan for consideration by the
24 Legislature.

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C. The provisions of this act shall be limited to diabetes information, data, initiatives, and programs within the Authority and the Department prior to the effective date of this act, unless there is available funding for diabetes in each agency that may be used for new research, data collection reporting, or other requirements of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.

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
