Announcing the passage of **SBs 101, 115, 149, 164, 223, 229, 293, 415** and **462**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

**SB 101** – By Allen of the Senate and Osborn and Bennett of the House.

An Act relating to bail bondsmen; changing eligibility for certain persons to be bail bondsmen; authorizing restaurant owners and certain persons to be licensed bail bondsmen upon certain conditions; defining terms; prohibiting executing duties or having an office on certain premises; excluding exception for bail enforcers; authorizing the ABLE

Commission to investigate and certify certain exceptions for licensure; requiring certain notification of disqualification; allowing reasonable fee; authorizing certain reimbursement for violations; revoking certain license for violation; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1315, which relates to persons prohibited from being bail bondsmen; making certain exceptions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**SB 115** – By Simpson of the Senate and Hardin of the House.

An Act relating to medical foster homes; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1950.1, as last amended by Section 5, Chapter 379, O.S.L. 2013 (63 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 1-1950.1), which relates to definitions; broadening certain definition to include certain facilities; and providing an effective date.

**SB 149** – By Garrison of the Senate and McPeak of the House.

An Act relating to eligibility for handgun license; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.10, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 1290.10), which relates to mandatory preclusions; modifying preclusive period for certain convictions; and providing an effective date.

**SB 223** – By Simpson of the Senate and Roberts (Dustin) of the House.

An Act relating to soldiers and sailors; amending 44 O.S. 2011, Section 232.2, which relates to the authorization of expenditures by the Adjutant General; modifying authorized expenditures; providing definitions; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to the State Board of Agriculture; amending 2 O.S. 2011, Section 2-4, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 25, O.S.L. 2014 (2 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 2-4), which relates to the powers of the Board; authorizing the Board to create a pollinator protection plan; and providing an effective date.

**SB 293** – By Simpson of the Senate and Ownbey of the House.

An Act relating to public assistance and benefits; providing for certain consideration of application to Department of Human Services or Oklahoma Health Care Authority under certain circumstances; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**SB 415** – By Brinkley of the Senate and McDaniel (Randy) of the House.

An Act relating to retirement; amending Section 2, Chapter 375, O.S.L. 2014, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 419, O.S.L. 2014 (74 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 935.2), which relates to defined contribution system; clarifying persons eligible for defined contribution system; modifying start of service; requiring certain type of employment for continued participation in system; and providing an effective date.

**SB 462** – By Brinkley of the Senate and McDaniel (Randy) of the House.

An Act relating to retirement; amending Section 11, Chapter 375, O.S.L. 2014 (74 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 935.11), which relates to qualified domestic orders; modifying certain payment requirements; and providing an effective date.
