SB 68 – By Holt of the Senate and Nelson of the House.

An Act relating to charter schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-132, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 212, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 3-132), which relates to charter school sponsorship; adding the governing body of a city that meets

certain criteria as a sponsor; modifying the definition of charter school; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-134, which relates to charter school applications; adding references to the governing body of a city as sponsor; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-142, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 212, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 3-142), which relates to charter school funding; adding references to the governing body of a city as a sponsor; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 173 – By Fry of the Senate and Banz of the House.

An Act relating to notaries public; amending Section 1, Chapter 26, O.S.L. 2012, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 347, O.S.L. 2014 (26 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 14-108.1), which relates to absentee ballots and affidavits; increasing maximum limit for certain notarial acts; and providing an effective date.

SB 249 – By Holt of the Senate and McBride of the House.

An Act relating to professional counseling; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1905, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013 (59 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 1905), which relates to duties and powers of the State Board of Behavioral Health Licensure; requiring Board to adopt emergency rules in certain circumstances; providing certain construction; and providing an effective date.

SB 376 – By Newberry of the Senate and McCall of the House.

An Act relating to Consumer Credit; amending 14A O.S. 2011, Sections 1-201, 3-505 and 6-501, which relate to territorial application, hearing examiner and Department of Consumer Credit; updating references and language; prohibiting certain charges, fees and contracts; including Internet transactions; providing for judicial review of final agency order; setting jurisdiction and venue; authorizing Consumer Credit Advisory Committee to make recommendations; and providing an effective date.

SB 386 – By Sparks and Pittman of the Senate and Cockroft of the House.

An Act relating to counties; amending 19 O.S. 2011, Section 941, which relates to county parking lots; modifying population restriction to allow for installation and operation of county-owned parking lots; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 418 – By Fields of the Senate and Biggs of the House.

[oversize or overweight motor vehicles - load vehicle permits - annual hay permit fee - ~~emergency~~]

SB 482 – By Marlatt of the Senate and Hickman of the House.
