MOTION

Representative Denney moved that **HR 1031** be recalled from enrollment and that the vote on adoption of the same be rescinded.

Representative Inman raised a point of order as to what House rule permitted consideration of a motion to rescind. The Presiding Officer ruled that the motion to rescind is a commonly used motion and that it would be up to the House to decide whether to adopt the motion to rescind.

Representative Proctor raised a point of inquiry as to when it would be in order to offer a motion to rescind, to which the Presiding Officer responded that for a motion to rescind to be in order, the relevant measure must be in the possession of the House, the time period for offering a motion to reconsider must have already passed and the motion to rescind must be scheduled through the Majority Floor Leader.

Representative Denney withdrew the motion to recall **HR 1031** from enrollment and to rescind the vote whereby **HR 1031** passed.

Representative Cleveland raised a point of order as to what the purpose would be of using the reconsideration process when a motion to rescind could also be offered at a later time. The Presiding Officer ruled that the motion to rescind was a proper motion, both under House Rules and general parliamentary procedure.
