**Second Regular Session of the Fifty-fifth Legislature**

**of the State of Oklahoma**

**Thirty-sixth Legislative Day, Tuesday, April 5, 2016**

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Denney.

The roll was called with 94 Members present.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.
