Fifty-seventh Legislative Day, Wednesday, May 11, 2016

FIRST READING

The following were introduced and read for the first time:

HB 3207 – By Sears and Casey of the House and Jolley and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Grand River Dam Authority; requiring payment of certain net revenues to the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury; specifying date of payment; specifying minimum amount of payment; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 3208 – By Sears and Casey of the House and Jolley and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 1113.2, which relates to the reissue of official vehicle license plates; clarifying references; authorizing additional registration fee; establishing fee amount; limiting time period when fee is applicable; apportioning certain amounts to certain revolving fund; providing for a reissuance of vehicle license plates; eliminating option for certain alternative method of license plate inventory management; establishing types of license plates subject to reissuance; establishing deadline for certain fee; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HJR 1073 – By Cockroft.

A Joint Resolution disapproving proposed permanent rules of the Oklahoma Department of Human Services; stating legislative intent; and directing distribution.
