Ninth Legislative Day, Monday, February 15, 2016

MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 2289, 2426, 2509** and **2544**.

HB 2289 – By Sanders of the House and Loveless of the Senate.

An Act relating to roads and bridges; amending 69 O.S. 2011, Section 702, which relates to the Department of Transportation; modifying method of notice related to certain surveys and examinations of property; and providing an effective date.

HB 2426 – By Kern and Bennett of the House and Allen of the Senate.

An Act relating to visitation; amending 43 O.S. 2011, Section 109.4, which relates to grandparental visitation rights; deleting reference to repealed statute; updating statutory citation; and providing an effective date.

HB 2509 – By Billy and Sherrer of the House and David of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1040.55, which relates to advertising requirements for adult cabarets and sexually oriented businesses; modifying scope of certain prohibited act; updating language; providing certain time limitation for nonconforming signs; and providing an effective date.

HB 2544 – By Nollan of the House and Stanislawski of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-109, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 242, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2015, Section 1-109), which relates to the length of the school year; changing certain notification date; deleting authorization and reporting requirement for school districts implementing an extended-day schedule; deleting grade restriction for implementation of an extended-day schedule; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
