Research Analysis

HB 1263 provides that a person who qualifies for an expungement due to the factual innocence of the person being established by the use of DNA who is granted an expungement by the court shall be reimbursed of all filing fees and court costs incurred relating to the filing of the expungement request. The payment of the \$150 fee to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to alter the record as a result of an expungement order resulting from the person being found factually innocent due to the use of DNA shall be waived.

Fiscal Analysis

According to officials at the OSBI, the current version of HB1263 would not have any significant operational or fiscal impact upon the agency. Further, expungements under Title 22 O.S. Section 13, Subsection A, Paragraph 3, factual innocence established through DNA, would be rare. The OSBI has never seen one.
