Research Analysis

HB 1350 provides that a person who has a prior conviction of stalking and, after being served with a protective order that prohibits contact with an individual, knowingly makes unconsented contact with the same individual is guilty of a felony. The fine is increased from not more than \$2,500 to not less than \$2,500. The fine for a subsequent stalking conviction with a ten year period is set at \$5,000.

Fiscal Analysis

HB1350 increases the minimum fine for a person convicted of stalking/violating a protective order, who has a prior conviction for same, to \$2,500.00.

Similarly, a person convicted of stalking within 10 years of execution of a sentence for a prior conviction of stalking or violating a protective order would remain incarcerated with DOC for a term of not less than 10 years and/or by a fine of not less than \$5,000.00.
