Research Analysis

The committee substitute to HB 1793 directs that the information submitted by the district court clerks to the Methamphetamine Offender Registry include the address of the residence of the person subject to registration and requires the person to give notice when changing address. The measure provides that any person failing to register is guilty of a misdemeanor subject to 1 year in the county jail and/or a \$500 fine. The methamphetamine offender registry website is to have an option to search for offenders using the last name of the offender and the type of information that is to be available during a search. The measure also provides that no governmental agency is liable for the release or publication of information maintained on the registry. The measure allows the OBND to release any registry information to an outside vendor responsible for administering data for the registry.
