HB 1966 creates the Organized Retail Crime Act. The measure provides definitions as used in the act. The measure provides that a person is guilty of organized retail crime under specified circumstances. The measure creates a seven-member Organized Retail Crime Advisory Board within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation.

Fiscal Analysis

HB1966 creates a felony for persons convicted of violating provisions set forth in HB1966. Those convicted and found guilty of organized retail crime(s) face a possible fine of \$5,000.00 and/or a five year sentence with the Department of Corrections.

Further, according to officials with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, “the current version of HB1966 is projected to have the following fiscal impact...

One Statistical Research Specialist at \$66,809 for salary, benefits, equipment, and operating costs. Travel expenses of Board members are difficult to project at this time but would probably be no more than \$5,000 per year.

OMES ISD estimates the cost to develop a database of organized retail crimes to be \$265,440. Total first year costs would be \$337,249 (annual recurring costs after 1st year would be \$112,849). Additional continuing GR appropriations to the OSBI would be necessary for implementation and management of this program.”
