Research Analysis

HB 2157, as introduced, creates the Family Support Accountability Act. The measure requires state agencies that provide home-visiting services develop a framework for service delivery and accountability across all programs and to promote a continuum of care for families. The bill also directs the programs to work with the Early Childhood Advisory Council to develop an outcomes measurement plan and submit that plan to the Governor, Legislature, Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth and the Early Childhood Advisory Council by January 1, 2016 and to develop a process for collecting and reporting outcome measures. Beginning December 1, 2017 the State Department of Health will be required to submit an annual outcomes report prepared by an independent entity to the Governor and Legislature.
