**Research Analysis**

**SB 110** requires the State Registrar of Vital Statistics to provide an electronic record of all births and paternity establishments to DHS; directs the Commissioner of Health to amend a birth certificate to show paternity and reflect the correct surname upon receipt of an electronic record from DHS indicating an acknowledgement of paternity or court order establishing paternity; requires the Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) to transmit a list of all registered deaths of Oklahoma residents for the preceding month to DHS so the department can take appropriate action if any of the individuals on the list participated in any program administered by the department, and requires OSDH to transmit a list of all registered births in the state for the preceding month to DHS to assist the department in administering programs related to children. Finally, the bill requires DHS to protect the integrity of the vital statistics records in the same manner as required of the OSDH.
