**Research Analysis**

SB 378 amends the Roofing Contractor Registration Act. The measure provides that affidavits of exemption for workers' compensation only apply to new residential projects, and that all maintenance or repair to existing residential structures as well as all commercial projects require workers compensation. Day laborers could be covered under their temporary labor agency. The bill also prevents any contractor covered under the RCRA from using labor that is not properly covered under workers' compensation insurance.

Finally, the measure shields homeowners from liability if someone working on their home is injured, if that person is working under a contract with a person or company required to register under RCRA and provide workers' compensation insurance.
