**Research Analysis**

The measure exempts Medal of Honor recipients both living and deceased from the requirements for consideration of designation proposals.

The measure designates the following memorial highways:

- Representative W.D. "Bill" Bradley Memorial Highway
- Sgt. Daniel M. Eshbaugh Memorial Highway
- Command Sergeant Major Benny G. Adkins Highway
- Captain George Green Memorial Highway

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure directs the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to place permanent markers upon a number of highways and bridges bearing the name of the individuals to be honored. 69 O.S. § 1600 provides that the costs associated with signage related to the naming of highways and bridges is to be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign, except in instances of naming a highway or bridge to honor members of the armed forces who were killed in action. For individuals named in this measure who are not armed forces members killed in action, the cost of the signage will be paid by the sponsoring group; for individuals who were armed forces member killed in action, the cost of the signage will be paid by the state.

According to the Department of Transportation, the estimated cost to the Department is between \$1,000 and \$2,000 per location depending on the class of highway.
