Research Analysis

SB 468 provides that a municipality or other political subdivision may enact reasonable ordinances and rules related to oil and gas operations within its boundaries, as long as they are consistent with Title 52 and Corporation Commission regulations, as well as setbacks and fencing requirements necessary for health and safety, but may not effectively ban or prohibit oil and gas operations. The measure includes a definition for “reasonable.” The bill also provides that any new rule, regulation, ordinance or law covering oil and gas that interferes with use of mineral estate, adversely impacts mineral development by increasing costs of oil and gas operations, or prohibits access to develop mineral estate, will be considered a “taking” pursuant to Article 2 of the Oklahoma Constitution.

The measure also repeals Title 52, Section 137: Municipal Corporations - Rights Not Limited.
