**Research Analysis**

SB 676 defines “state implementation plan,” which is required by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency as a means to meet federal standards for clean air. The measure creates statutory SIP requirements, such as consideration of its effect on small business and local regulation efforts, and an approval process that includes the Oklahoma Office of the Attorney General and the Legislature.

**Fiscal Analysis**

Regarding SB 676, DEQ states:

“The fiscal impact will consist primarily of the additional personnel time necessary to do the impact evaluations and prepare the required reports. It is difficult to estimate how much additional personnel time and effort will be necessary, as it will depend in part on the nature of the new federal requirements and the level of data and detail that may be sought in the reports, so DEQ is unable to quantify the potential impact to the agency.”
