13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 956 of Title 63, unless there is
16 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 The Chief Medical Examiner may equip vehicles that are used to
18 investigate deaths with flashing lights and sirens. The Chief
19 Medical Examiner may authorize such vehicles to exceed the maximum
20 speed limits so long as speeding does not endanger life or property.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
