9	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Home Service Contract
10	Act; amending 36 O.S. 2011, Sections 6751, as amended by Section 37, Chapter 150, O.S.L. 2012 and 6752 (36
11	O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 6751), which relate to purpose of act and definitions; modifying purpose and
12	applicability of act to home warranties; modifying definition; specifying that home service contracts
13	and home warranties are not insurance and not regulated by Insurance Code; providing for
14	codification; and providing an effective date.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 36 O.S. 2011, Section 6751, as
18	amended by Section 37, Chapter 150, O.S.L. 2012 (36 O.S. Supp. 2020,
19	Section 6751), is amended to read as follows:
20	Section 6751. A. The purpose of the Oklahoma Home Service
21	Contract Act is to create an independent legal framework within
22	which home service contracts and home warranties are defined, may be
23	sold and are regulated in this state. The Oklahoma Home Service
24	Contract Act declares that home service contracts and home

1 warranties, as defined in Section 6752 of this title, are not 2 insurance and not otherwise subject to the Insurance Code. The 3 Oklahoma Home Service Contract Act requires simple registration, financial assurance options and enforcement by the Insurance 4 5 Commissioner. Proper registration under the Oklahoma Home Service Contract Act exempts applicability under the Service Warranty Act, 6 7 which may regulate extended warranty, retail, automobile and agreements not defined in the Oklahoma Home Service Contract Act. 8 9 Nothing in the Service Warranty Act is changed or amended by the 10 Oklahoma Home Service Contract Act.

B. The following items are exempt from the provisions of theOklahoma Home Service Contract Act:

13 1. Warranties as defined in Section 6752 of this title;

14 2. Maintenance agreements as defined in Section 6752 of this 15 title; and

3. Service contracts sold or offered for sale to persons other
 than consumers, consumer product (extended warranty) service
 contracts on new retail goods if made at the time of sale and motor
 vehicle service contracts, all of which may be separately regulated
 elsewhere in the Oklahoma Statutes.

C. The types of agreements covered by the Oklahoma Home Service Contract Act are not insurance and do not have to comply with any other provision of the Insurance Code outside of the Oklahoma Home Service Contract Act. 1SECTION 2.AMENDATORY36 O.S. 2011, Section 6752, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 6752. As used in the Oklahoma Home Service Contract 4 Act:

1. "Administrator" means the person who is responsible for the
administration of home service contracts or the home service
contracts plan, who may promote the contract under their own private
label or brand as long as the provider is clearly identified on the
contract, or who is responsible for any submission required by the
Oklahoma Home Service Contract Act;

11 2. "Commissioner" means the Insurance Commissioner;

3. "Consumer" means a natural person who buys other than for purposes of resale any tangible personal property that is distributed in commerce and that is normally used for personal, family or household purposes and not for business or research purposes;

17 4. "Maintenance agreement" means a contract of limited duration
18 that provides for scheduled maintenance only and does not include
19 repair or replacement;

S. "Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,
 incorporated or unincorporated association, joint stock company,
 reciprocal, syndicate or any similar entity or combination of
 entities acting in concert;

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6. "Provider" means the person who is the contractually named
 obligor to the home service contract holder under the terms of the
 service contract;

4 7. "Provider fee" means the consideration paid for a home 5 service contract;

8. "Reimbursement insurance policy" means a policy of insurance
issued to a provider to either provide reimbursement to the provider
under the terms of the insured home service contracts issued or sold
by the provider or, in the event of the provider's nonperformance,
to pay on behalf of the provider all covered contractual obligations
incurred by the provider under the terms of the insured home service
contracts issued or sold by the provider;

9. "Home service contract" or "home warranty" means a contract 13 or agreement for a separately stated consideration for a specific 14 15 duration to perform the service, repair, replacement or maintenance 16 of property or indemnification for service, repair, replacement or maintenance, for the operational or structural failure of any 17 residential property due to a defect in materials, workmanship, 18 inherent defect or normal wear and tear, with or without additional 19 provisions for incidental payment or indemnity under limited 20 circumstances. Home service contracts may provide for the service, 21 repair, replacement, or maintenance of property for damage resulting 22 from power surges or interruption and accidental damage from 23 24 handling and may provide for leak or repair coverage to house

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1 roofing systems. Home service contracts <u>and home warranties</u> are not 2 insurance in this state or otherwise regulated under the Insurance 3 Code;

4 10. "Service contract holder" or "contract holder" means a 5 person who is the purchaser or holder of a home service contract; 6 and

7 11. "Warranty" means a warranty made solely by the manufacturer, importer or seller of property or services τ including 8 9 builders on new home construction, without consideration, that is 10 not negotiated or separated from the sale of the product and is 11 incidental to the sale of the product, that guarantees indemnity for 12 defective parts, mechanical or electrical breakdown, labor or other remedial measures, such as repair or replacement of the property or 13 repetition of services. 14

15 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 632.1 of Title 36, unless there 17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Home service contracts and home warranties, as defined in Section 6752 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes, are not insurance in this state or otherwise regulated under the Insurance Code.

21 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
