- C. No chief executive officer or other administrative head of a state agency which has the power to issue a license to a natural person or any person having authority to act on such chief executive officer's or administrative head's behalf shall directly or indirectly solicit support or opposition for legislation from any natural person who holds a license issued by that agency.
- D. The provisions of subsection C of this section shall not be applicable to a person who serves on the governing board of the agency or a person who is appointed to serve on a task force or similar entity created by a legislative measure.
- E. Any person convicted of willfully violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a felony and shall be punished by the imposition of a fine of not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or by imprisonment for not longer than two (2) years, or by both said fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2009.
