18	WHEREAS, a federal law mandating participation in a health care
19	system is a direct violation of states' rights.
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
21	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 52ND OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
22	THAT the Oklahoma Legislature petitions the federal government
23	to opt-out of any federal mandates related to health care reform.

2	for waivers to the state Medicaid program to enable Oklahoma to
3	implement its own health care reform measures.
4	THAT the Oklahoma Legislature petitions the federal government
5	to return any taxes collected from Oklahomans or Oklahoma businesses
6	under federal health care reform to the state in a block grant to
7	enable Oklahoma to implement its own health care reform measures.
8	THAT the Oklahoma Health Care Authority is directed to submit to
9	the federal government any formal requests under this resolution.
LO	THAT the Secretary of State distribute a copy of this resolution
