Bill Summary

The committee substitute for HB1072 changes the minimum number of signatures required to form a recognized political party from a number equal to 5% of the votes cast in the last general election to 5% of the votes cast in the last General Election for Governor. (Five percent of the votes cast in the 2008 presidential election equals 73,134 and 5% of the votes cast in the last general election for Governor in 2006 equals 46,324.

Fiscal Summary

The Committee Substitute for HB 1072 modifies the requirement for the formation of a recognized political party. The measure deletes language referring to the percentage of total votes cast in a General Election for President and Vice President as a basis for the number of signatures required for a political party to become recognized under the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

Fiscal Analysis

In its present form, there is no impact on state revenues or resources under the provisions of the Committee Substitute for HB 1072.
