**Bill Summary**

Senate Amendment No. to HB 2161 prohibits school districts from allowing an individual or organization to speak or distribute material at an in-service teacher meeting for the purpose of (1) influencing the results of an election for state or local office, excluding school bond elections or (2) political fundraising for or against a candidate. The language does not prohibit elected officials from speaking or distributing material as long as the activity does not involve influencing elections or fundraising.

Engrossed HB2161 prohibits school districts from allowing a speaker(s) at an in-service teacher meeting to speak and distribute material for the purpose of influencing the results of a state or local election or political fundraising.
