**Bill Summary**

House Bill 2750 requires that Oklahoma history courses include information about the April 19, 1995, bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City and the role it played in the history of Oklahoma and the nation from April 19, 1995, to present. The State Department of Education may make materials available to public schools and the State Textbook Committee shall incorporate provisions of this law when considering textbooks for United States and Oklahoma history.

**Fiscal Summary**

HB 2750, as introduced, requires the social studies core curriculum on Oklahoma History to include an element on the Oklahoma City Bombing.

**Fiscal Analysis**

Provisions of the measure do not impact the state, as the Board incurs no cost to include this element as a part of the state's history, and new materials can be adopted when the textbooks are normally purchased.
