L7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L8	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L9	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5-601 of Title 2, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. There is hereby created to continue until July 1, 2017, in
22	accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, the

establishing standards governing the care and well-being of

- 1 livestock and poultry in this state. In carrying out its purpose,
- 2 the Board shall endeavor to maintain food safety, encourage
- 3 Oklahoma-grown and -raised food, and protect Oklahoma farms and
- 4 | families. The Board shall be comprised of the following fifteen
- 5 (15) members:
- 1. The Commissioner of Agriculture who shall be the Chair of the Board;
- 2. The State Veterinarian in the Oklahoma Department ofAgriculture, Food, and Forestry;
 - 3. The Dean of Agriculture for Oklahoma State University;
- 11 4. The Dean of the College of Veterinary Medicine for Oklahoma 12 State University;
 - 5. The Chair of the Agriculture Committee or a succeeding committee with responsibilities related to agriculture for the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
 - 6. The Chair of the Agriculture Committee or a succeeding committee with responsibilities related to agriculture for the Oklahoma State Senate;
- 7. Seven members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. The seven members appointed by the Governor shall be residents of the state and shall be selected from a list of three recommendations submitted by the following groups:

- a. one member selected from the recommendations submitted by a statewide association which represents the cattle industry in Oklahoma,
- b. one member selected from the recommendations submitted
 by a statewide council which represents pork producers
 in Oklahoma,
- c. one member selected from the recommendations submitted by a statewide federation which represents the poultry industry in Oklahoma,
- d. one member selected from the recommendations submitted by a statewide organization which represents the equine industry in Oklahoma,
- e. one member selected from the recommendations submitted by a statewide organization which represents the dairy industry in Oklahoma,
- f. one member selected from the recommendations submitted by a statewide organization that primarily represents independent agricultural producers whose direct consumer sales account for over fifty percent (50%) of their business, and
- g. one member selected from the recommendations submitted by an Oklahoma-chartered humane society; and

8. Two members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate who shall be residents of the state and shall represent Oklahoma consumers.

- B. 1. The initial appointment of each member appointed to the Oklahoma Livestock Care Standards Board by the Governor pursuant to paragraph 7 of subsection A of this section shall be for progressive terms of one (1) through five (5) years, with three members serving five-year initial terms. The initial appointment of each member appointed by the Governor pursuant to paragraph 8 of subsection A of this section shall be for five (5) years. Subsequent appointments by the Governor shall be for five-year terms. Members shall continue to serve until their successors are appointed. Any vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms.
- 2. The Board shall meet regularly at any time as called by the Chair or upon the request of four or more members of the Board, but in no case shall the Board meet less than one time per year.
- 3. A majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum to transact business, but no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining members to exercise all the powers of the Board.
- 4. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall provide staff, support and information as requested by the Board.

5. Members of the Board shall receive no compensation for serving on the Board, but shall receive travel reimbursement from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry as follows:

- a. legislative members shall be reimbursed in accordance with Section 457 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and
- b. all other members of the Board shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
- 6. The Board shall act in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.
- C. The Oklahoma Livestock Care Standards Board shall have authority to recommend standards governing the care and well-being of livestock and poultry in this state, subject to the authority of the State Board of Agriculture to administer and enforce. In establishing those standards, the Board shall consider factors that include, but are not limited to, agricultural best management practices for care and well-being, biosecurity, disease prevention, animal morbidity and mortality data, food safety practices, and the protection of local, affordable food supplies for consumers.
- D. The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall have the authority to administer and enforce the standards
