15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2222.1 of Title 74, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission may sell real
20	estate and personal property owned by the State of Oklahoma or the
21	Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department that is under the
22	jurisdiction of the Commission located within Delaware County and
23	situated within Honey Creek State Park.

- B. The sale of real estate and personal property authorized pursuant to subsection A of this section shall be subject to all existing easements and reservations of record. The Commission or Department may transfer any interests held including, but not limited to, licenses, operating permits and leasehold interests to a subsequent purchaser.
- C. The Commission and Department shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 129.4 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the sale. All monies received from the sale of the property, except those monies necessary to pay the expenses incurred pursuant to the sale, shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department Revolving Fund 215 ("215 Fund"). Revenue derived from the real estate and personal property sale deposited to the fund shall be utilized for the benefit of the state park system. The real estate and personal property sale shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 456.7 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
