**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute creates the Bill of Rights Education Act which instructs the State Board of Education to adopt a certain social studies core curriculum. The curriculum must include study of the Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution including the Bill of Rights, substantive selections from the Federalist Papers, the Emancipation Proclamation, the Articles of Confederation, the Gettysburg Address and George Washington's Farewell Address. The State Textbook Committee must adopt "A Guide for Learning and Teaching the Declaration of Independence and the United States Constitution" by Joseph Andrews, no later than August 1, 2011. The committee must use the topics mentioned above to evaluate other U.S. history, U.S. government and Oklahoma history textbooks.
