**Fiscal Analysis**

Senate amendments to HB 2115 do not impact the main measure. Applying the provisions of the School Consolidation and Annexation Act to a greater number of school districts does not require additional state appropriations, and therefore does not impact the state. However, expanding the number of districts with access to the School Consolidation Assistance Fund could potentially lead to greater demand for monies from the Fund (depending on other factors, such as the number of districts planning to consolidate in coming months), but could also decrease administrative costs for participating school districts.
