**Research Analysis**

HB2429 as introduced designates the portion of State Highway 22 from the junction of State Highway 22 and State Highway 1 extending east to the intersection of State Highway 22 and northbound U.S. Highway 377 as the “SSGT Chaz Allen Highway” and provides for permanent suitable markers to be placed upon the highway bearing that name. The bill further designates the bridge crossing Coal Creek on State Highway 1 in Coal County as the “Randy Derrick Memorial Bridge” and provides for permanent suitable markers to be placed upon the bridge bearing that name.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure directs the Department of Transportation (ODOT) to place permanent markers upon the highway bearing the name. ODOT estimates the cost of markers to average \$650.00 each and, with the placement of markers for each direction of travel, the total estimated cost for placement is \$2,600.
