**Research Analysis**

The PCS for HB 3135 states that the Department of Human Services is not prohibited from providing a summary of an individual's child welfare history to a person who has applied to be a foster or adoptive placement resource or legal guardian with a federally recognized Indian tribe. The bill also provides that the department is not prohibited from disclosing information concerning alleged child abuse or neglect that has been made public by a law enforcement agency when the disclosure is limited to confirmation of the child's safety and whether the child has been taken into custody.
