**Research Analysis**

Floor amendment No. 1 to Senate Bill 435 makes the State Board of Education a 12-member board. The governor will appoint six of those members with the consent of the Senate. Five members will be elected, one from each congressional district in the state. Members elected to serve from even-numbered congressional districts will serve an initial term of two years. After that members elected from even-numbered districts will serve four year terms. Beginning at the second general election after the effective date of the act, three members will be elected, one from each odd-numbered congressional district. Those members will serve four-year terms. The governor must appoint members, with the consent of the Senate, to fill any vacancy prior to a general election. The state superintendent of public instruction will be the 12<sup>th</sup> member of the board.
