General Description of <u>Major Differences</u> between the current report and the version last seen and voted on in the House and the sections in which such differences are located:

√ Changes from engrossed House measure which were made in the Senate and contained in conference committee report/substitute (applies *only* to House measures):

Section 1. "Student volunteer" is defined as a student enrolled in an accredited institution of higher education who, as carrying out coursework, will have or is likely to have direct contact with students in public or private schools. School districts may request in writing to the OSBI, rather than the State Board of Education, that a national criminal history record check be conducted of any prospective volunteer. School districts also may request that an Oklahoma criminal history record check with fingerprint analysis be conducted of any prospective volunteer. The OSBI will require that the district pay a fee of up to \$19. An accredited institution of higher education may request in writing to the State Department of Education that a national criminal history record check be conducted for a student volunteer.

√ Changes made in conference:

Section 1. Provides that the provisions will not apply to prospective volunteers who have or are likely to have unsupervised access to students and who serve as medical professionals, sports referees, school concession stand volunteers or in similar capacities as determined by the local board of education.
