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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified							
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 332.21 of Title 57, unless there							
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:							
19	A. Sections 1 through 5 of this act shall be known and may be							
20	cited as the "Parole of Aging Prisoners Act".							
21	B. The purpose of the Parole of Aging Prisoners Act is to							
22	reduce unnecessary costs to state taxpayers by empowering the Pardon							
23	and Parole Board to parole prisoners who:							
24	1. Are sixty-five (65) years of age or older;							

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- 2. Have served at least ten (10) years in prison, or one-third (1/3) of the total term or terms of imprisonment;
 - 3. Pose minimal public safety risks warranting continued incarceration;
 - 4. Are not incarcerated for a crime pursuant to Section 13.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
 - 5. Have not been convicted of a crime that would require the person to be subject to the registration requirements of the Sex Offenders Registration Act.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 332.22 of Title 57, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

For the purposes of this act:

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- 1. "Aging prisoner" means any person incarcerated by the Department of Corrections who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older; and
- 2. "Evidence-based" means policies, procedures, programs and practices that scientific research demonstrates is an accurate assessment of the risks a prisoner poses to public safety when placed on conditional release.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 332.23 of Title 57, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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- A. The authority to grant parole under Section 4 of this act shall rest with the Pardon and Parole Board.
- B. The Pardon and Parole Board shall use an evidence-based risk assessment instrument to assess the public safety risk posed by aging prisoners upon release.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 332.24 of Title 57, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Unless eligible for release at an earlier date, an aging prisoner who has been committed to the Department of Corrections for a term or terms of imprisonment shall have the ability to request a parole hearing before the Pardon and Parole Board if the prisoner has served, in actual custody, the shorter of:
 - 1. Ten (10) years of the term or terms of imprisonment; or
 - 2. One-third (1/3) of the total term or terms of imprisonment.
- B. Once a prisoner requests a parole hearing under subsection A of this section, the Pardon and Parole Board shall place the inmate on the next available docket.
- 1. The Pardon and Parole Board shall grant parole to a prisoner if the Board finds by a preponderance of the evidence that the prisoner, if released, can live and remain at liberty without posing a substantial risk to public safety.

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- 2. The Pardon and Parole Board shall use the selected evidencebased risk assessment instrument to make the determination provided for in paragraph 1 of this subsection. 3. The Pardon and Parole Board shall provide to the prisoner the opportunity to speak on his or her own behalf and the option of
