16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be		
18	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:		
19	A. There is hereby created until October 31, 2014, the "Common		
20	Core Task Force". The purpose of the Task Force shall be to study		
21	the issues involved in adopting, implementing and aligning the state		
22	subject matter curriculum with the K-12 Common Core State Standards,		
23	developed by the Common Core State Standards Initiative, as provided

for in Section 11-103.6a of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. The Task Force shall consist of thirteen (13) members as follows:

- 1. Two members of the House Common Education Committee or House Appropriations Subcommittee on Education who have a bachelor's degree in business or accounting or who have five (5) or more years of experience in the area of business or accounting, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
- 2. Two members of the Senate Education Committee or Senate
  Appropriation Committee on Education who have a bachelor's degree in
  business or accounting or who have five (5) or more years of
  experience in the area of business or accounting, appointed by the
  President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;
- 3. One member who represents a statewide association of teachers, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
- 4. One member who represents a statewide organization that represents public school superintendents, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;
- 5. One member who represents a statewide organization that represents parents of public school students, appointed by the Governor;
- 6. One member who shall be the principal author of the bill from the Oklahoma House of Representatives;

7. One member who shall be the principal author of the bill from the Oklahoma State Senate; and

- 8. Four members who are superintendents of a public school district in the state appointed by the Governor, one of whom shall represent a rural school district located in the eastern portion of the state, one of whom shall represent a rural school district located in the western portion of the state, two of whom shall represent an urban school district located in a county having a population of more than five hundred thousand (500,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial Census.
- C. Appointment to the Task Force shall be made by August 1, 2013. The House principal author shall be the chair and the Senate principal author shall be the cochair. The Task Force shall conduct an organizational meeting not later than August 31, 2013.
- D. The Task Force shall investigate and make recommendations regarding:
- 1. The costs associated with adopting, implementing and aligning the state subject matter curriculum with the K-12 Common Core State Standards, developed by the Common Core State Standards Initiative, as provided for in Section 11-103.6a of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, including any costs associated with revising the state testing program; and
- 2. Any other costs or issues associated with adopting the Common Core curriculum.

1 The Task Force shall not be subject to the Oklahoma Open 2 Meeting Act or the Oklahoma Open Records Act. The Task Force shall be authorized to meet at such times as 3 F. may be required in order to fulfill the duties imposed upon the Task 5 Force by law. Members of the Task Force shall not be reimbursed for 6 travel expenses. 7 G. Staff assistance for the Task Force shall be provided by the 8 Oklahoma House of Representatives. 9 Η. The Task Force shall complete its study not later than 10 October 31, 2014. 11 SECTION 2.
