Supp. 2012, Section 3-173), which relates to the Oklahoma Advisory Council on Indian 19 Education; extending termination date; providing for the establishment of a Science, Technology, 20 Engineering and Mathematics advanced placement course participation pilot program; directing the State 2.1 Department of Education to administer the program; requiring the leveraging of certain existing 22 programs; providing for an application and selection process; listing certain elements of the program; 23 requiring the Department to establish criteria for

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determining gains; providing for an annual report;

directing the State Board of Education to promulgate

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rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-123.2 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. On or before July 1, 2014, the State Board of Education shall identify programs that provide training and evaluations for school districts in operational efficiency.
 - B. The State Board of Education may contract with outside entities, which may include private partners providing funds, grants or the donation of services, to furnish quality training for the State Department of Education, school district boards of education and school district superintendents in the area of efficiency and cost savings.
 - C. A school district may submit to the State Department of Education any information the Department determines is necessary to:
 - 1. Evaluate the current operations of the school district; and
 - 2. Recommend operational efficiencies and financial savings for the school district.
 - D. All cost savings attributable to implementation of the operational efficiencies recommended in an evaluation shall be retained by the school district in which the evaluation occurred.

- E. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules, as
- 2 necessary, to implement the provisions of this section.
- 3 | SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-173, as
- 4 | amended by Section 596, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp.
- 5 | 2012, Section 3-173), is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Section 3-173. A. There is hereby created to continue until
- 7 July 1, 2014 2018, in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma
- 8 | Sunset Law, the Oklahoma Advisory Council on Indian Education.
- 9 B. The Council shall:
- 10 1. Make recommendations to the State Board of Education and the
- 11 | Superintendent of Public Instruction in educational matters
- 12 | affecting the education of Native American students;
- 2. Promote educational opportunities and improvement of the
- 14 quality of education provided to Native American students throughout
- 15 | the state:

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- 3. Advocate for Native American students in the state; and
- 4. Monitor and evaluate how the public education system of the
- 18 | state impacts Native American students.
- 19 C. The Council shall be composed of eighteen (18) members as
- 20 follows:
- 21 1. Five members who shall each represent an Indian tribe in the
- 22 | state, of which at least one shall represent an Indian tribe which
- has an enrollment of less than ten thousand (10,000) members who

reside in the state, appointed by the Governor from a list of nominations submitted by the different Indian tribes in the state;

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- 2. Four members who shall each represent the tribal education departments of an Indian tribe in the state, appointed by the Governor from a list of nominations submitted by the different Indian tribes in the state;
- 7 3. One member who shall represent the Oklahoma Council on 8 Indian Education, appointed by the Governor;
- 9 4. Two members who shall represent two different statewide 10 organizations representing public school teachers, appointed by the 11 President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
 - 5. One member who shall represent a statewide organization representing public school superintendents appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
 - 6. One member who shall represent Oklahoma tribal colleges, appointed by the Chancellor of Higher Education;
- 7. The Director of the Native American Cultural and Educational Authority, or designee;
 - 8. The Chancellor of Higher Education, or designee;
- 9. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education, or designee; and
- 22 10. The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or designee.
- D. Appointments to the Council shall be made by September 1, 24 2010. The first meeting of the Council shall be called by the

- 1 Superintendent of Public Instruction. At the first meeting, the members of the Council shall elect a chair and vice-chair from among 3 the members. Meetings of the Council shall be held at least quarterly at the call of the chair. Members shall serve at the 5 pleasure of their appointing authorities. A majority of the members of the Council shall constitute a quorum to transact business, but 7 no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining members to exercise all of the powers of the Council. A vacancy on the Council 8 shall be filled by the original appointing authority. The State 10 Department of Education, Oklahoma Department of Career and 11 Technology Education, and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 12 Education shall provide staff, support and information as requested 13 by the Council.
 - E. Members of the Council shall receive no compensation for serving on the Council, but shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:

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- 1. State employees who are members of the Council shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act; and
- 2. All other members of the Council shall be reimbursed by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

- F. The Council shall act in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.
- G. Members who serve on the Council shall be exempt from the dual-office-holding prohibitions of Section 6 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
 - H. The Council shall have the following duties:

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- 1. Identify strategies for developing an efficient and reliable process of communications between Oklahoma education entities, educators, tribal organizations and other interested parties;
- 2. Identify and disseminate research-based, measurable criteria, both behavioral and academic, by which the success and efficacy of the education offered to Native American students in Oklahoma may be measured;
- 3. Analyze data to ensure that education agencies in Oklahoma continue to address the education needs of Native American students;
- 4. Encourage and promote Native American educational leadership at all levels of the education system; and
- 5. Make recommendations to the State Board of Education for programs that will help achieve the purposes of the Oklahoma Advisory Council on Indian Education Act.
- I. The Council shall evaluate and make an annual report on the effectiveness of the public education system in Oklahoma in meeting the needs of Native American students in Oklahoma. The report shall be submitted to the State Board of Education. The report shall also

contain a summary of the findings made by the Council pursuant to subsection H of this section, a summary of all data collected by the Council, a summary of the means by which all data was collected by the Council, and any other information deemed necessary by the Council.

- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.704 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Subject to the availability of funds, it is the intent of the Legislature to expand career- and college-readiness for Oklahoma students through a common education pilot program that increases participation and success in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) advanced placement courses. The program shall be administered by the State Department of Education and shall leverage existing private and public programs in the state that have shown dramatic increase in advanced placement course and test success.
- B. The State Department of Education shall create a process for schools to apply to participate in the pilot project program. A selection process shall be created by the Department that selects schools on the basis of need, demography, and the desire of teachers and administration to participate.
- C. The pilot project program shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following elements, with additional elements added

1 by the Department if possible within the budget and if needed to 2 meet the school goals:

- 1. Analysis of current school college- and career-readiness;
- Goal setting for very aggressive college- and careerreadiness goals;

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- 3. Purchase of proper equipment and resources to meet advanced placement science and math requirements;
- 4. Teacher training through summer institutes for advanced placement teachers;
- 5. Teacher training for teachers in grades three through ten to increase rigor in preparation for more difficult classes as well as college-, career- and citizen-ready state standards;
- 6. Funding to pay for up to one-half (1/2) of the advanced placement test fee for students participating in the program;
- 7. Tutoring for students enrolled in advanced placement courses, as well as Saturday study sessions, to increase time on task for students;
- 8. Awards for teachers teaching an advanced placement course or courses in the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for every student in their class who is successful on an advanced placement test; and
- 9. Awards to students in the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) who successfully complete an advanced placement test at a

minimum percentage passing rate as established by the State Department of Education.

- D. The State Department of Education shall establish criteria for determining the academic gains of schools participating in the program based on an analysis of advanced placement participation and test results and shall issue an annual report on the program to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- E. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules, as necessary, to implement the provisions of this section.
 - SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.
- SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
