

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending
21 O.S. 2011, Sections 1212 and 1213, as amended by
Section 1, Chapter 187, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp.
2013, Section 1213), which relate to the unlawful
removal of objects from a disaster area; clarifying
scope of crime; providing penalty; and providing an
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1212, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 1212. A. It shall be unlawful for any person except an
authorized person to proceed to or to remain at a disaster area for
the purpose of being a bystander, spectator, sightseer or souvenir
hunter; ~~or.~~

1 B. It shall be unlawful for ~~any such~~ a person, other than the
2 owner or a person authorized by the owner, to take or remove from
3 ~~the~~ a disaster area, or disturb or move, any ~~material objects~~
4 property, equipment or thing either directly or indirectly relating
5 or pertaining to the disaster.

6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1213, as
7 amended by Section 1, Chapter 187, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2013,
8 Section 1213), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 1213. ~~1- A.~~ A. It is a misdemeanor for any person to
10 violate any of the provisions of Section 1209 et seq. of this title.

11 ~~2- B.~~ B. Every person convicted of a misdemeanor for violating any
12 provision of Section 1209 et seq. of this title shall be punished by
13 a fine of not more than Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or by
14 imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or by both such fine
15 and imprisonment.

16 C. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A of this
17 section, a violation of subsection B of Section 1212 of this title
18 is a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the
19 Department of Corrections not exceeding seven (7) years and not less
20 than two (2) years.

21 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
