## 7 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to schools; creating the Education Improvement Act of 2013; establishing the School District Empowerment Program; stating purpose; exempting certain districts from certain statutory requirements and rules; granting school districts certain options; specifying certain requirements participating school districts shall comply with; identifying districts for participation and implementation of program; specifying method of selection of remaining districts and timeline for implementation; specifying certain categories of school districts; authorizing consolidating or annexing school districts to enter into a contract prohibiting the closing of school sites unless certain agreed-to conditions are met; specifying optional conditions; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Sections 8-103 and 8-103.1, which relate to the Education Open Transfer Act; deleting certain application deadline; allowing applications to be filed at any time during a school year; changing certain notification, review, reporting and cancellation deadlines; allowing a student to transfer at any time upon approval; updating language; deleting transfer procedure for deaf or hearing impaired students; authorizing school districts to include certain deadlines in the transfer policy; updating statutory citations; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 35e, which relates to dropout reports; deleting obsolete language; modifying definition of school dropout; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.509, which relates to the administration of certain tests; providing that school counselors shall not be required to coordinate certain tests; providing for codification; providing

for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

6 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 7 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Education Improvement Act of 2013".

- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-128.1 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby established the School District Empowerment Program which shall be administered by the State Board of Education. The purpose of the program is to empower locally elected school board members to govern school districts and make decisions based on the needs of their students and circumstances.
- B. Except as otherwise provided for in this subsection, a school district identified by the State Board of Education for participation in the School District Empowerment Program shall be exempt from all statutory requirements and State Board of Education rules from which charter schools are exempt as provided for in the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act. Nothing in this section shall prevent a school district board of education from choosing to follow any or

- all state laws, rules, or regulations from which a charter school is
  exempt. A participating school district shall have the option to
  adopt policies to implement any requirement for the school district
  that is consistent with any statutory requirement or mandate or
  Board rule, but a participating school district shall comply with
  the following requirements:
  - 1. Students who reside in the school district shall be entitled to attend school in the district as set forth in Section 1-114 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

- 2. School districts shall comply with the requirements of the minimum salary schedule for teachers as set forth in Section 18-114.12 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 3. Employees of school districts shall continue to participate as members of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma as set forth in Section 17-101 et seq. of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 4. School districts shall comply with the requirement to provide a health insurance plan for school district employees as set forth in Section 5-117.5 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and to establish or make available to school district employees a cafeteria plan as set forth in Section 26-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 5. School districts shall require any person employed by the school district to file with the district board a current Oklahoma

criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Each district shall adopt a policy regarding criminal history record checks as set forth in Section 5-142 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

- 6. School districts shall comply with the requirement to evaluate teachers and to train personnel designated to conduct personnel evaluations as set forth in Sections 6-101.10 and 6-101.11 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the dismissal and due process procedures for administrators as set forth in Sections 6-101.13 through 6-101.15 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and the due process procedures for teachers as set forth in Sections 6-101.21 through 6-101.26 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 7. School districts shall comply with the requirement to make payroll deductions for either or both professional organization dues and political contributions upon the request of an employee as set forth in Section 5-139 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 8. School districts shall employ as teachers, counselors, librarians, school nurses, superintendents, principals, supervisors, or any other instructional, supervisory or administrative employee, only those persons who are certified or licensed by the State Board of Education in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation

Act, except for persons exempt from the certification or licensure requirements as otherwise provided by law;

- 9. School districts shall be required to offer and students enrolled in the school district shall be required to complete the curriculum requirements as set forth in Section 11-103.6 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 10. Students enrolled in the school district shall be required to demonstrate mastery of the state academic content standards as set forth in Section 1210.523 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
- 11. Members of the school district board of education shall be required to satisfy the instruction and continuing education requirements as set forth in Sections 5-110, 5-110.1 and 5-110.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- C. School districts which include a school that has been identified as in need of improvement for the 2013-2014 school year by the State Board of Education shall be identified for participation in the School District Empowerment Program and shall implement the program beginning in the 2014-2015 school year.
- D. By September 30, 2014, the State Board of Education shall adopt during an open meeting a five-year implementation schedule for participating school districts that provides for all school districts to be participating by the fifth year. For the implementation schedule, the Board shall randomly select twenty

- percent (20%) of the school districts, excluding school districts

  identified pursuant to subsection C of this section, from each of

  the following categories for implementation each school year

  beginning with the 2015-2016 school year through the 2019-2020

  school year:
  - 1. Districts with an Average Daily Membership (ADM) of less than two hundred fifty (250);

- 2. Districts with an ADM of less than five hundred (500) and greater than or equal to two hundred fifty (250);
- 3. Districts with an ADM of less than two thousand (2,000) and greater than or equal to five hundred (500); and
  - 4. Districts with an ADM of two thousand (2,000) or more.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7-109 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A school district which desires to consolidate with or annex territory comprising the entire school district to one or more existing school districts in accordance with the provisions of Sections 7-101 through 7-108 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be authorized to enter into a contract with the school district or districts whom they consolidate with or annex to, which provides that a school site located within the consolidated or annexed school district will not be closed unless certain conditions are met as agreed to by the school districts in the contract.

Conditions that may be provided for in a contract include, but are not limited to, a minimum student enrollment threshold, distribution of student population within the school district, community impact, and transportation costs.

SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 8-103, is amended to read as follows:

Section 8-103. A. In order that any student may be transferred, an application form specified by the State Board of Education must be completed by the parents of the student. purposes of the Education Open Transfer Act, the term "parent" means the parent of the student or person having custody of the student as provided for in paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 1-113 of this title. The application shall be obtained from and filed with the superintendent of the receiving school district for transfers to school districts in the State of Oklahoma and with the State Board of Education for transfers to school districts in another state. Except as otherwise provided for in this section, applications shall be filed no later than April 1 of the school year preceding the school year for which the transfer is desired. By April 1 of the same school year Applications may be filed at any time during the school year with the receiving school district. Within ten (10) days of receipt of the application, the receiving school district shall notify the resident school district that an application for transfer has been filed by a student enrolled in the resident school

district. The board of education of the receiving school district shall approve or deny the application for transfer not later than June 1 of the same year within thirty (30) days of receipt of the application and shall notify the parents of the student of the decision. By July 1 of the same year Within ten (10) days of receiving notice from the receiving school district, the parents of the student shall notify the receiving school district that the student will be enrolling in that school district. Failure of parents to notify the district as required may result in loss of the student's right to enroll in the district for that year. Upon approval of the receiving school district, the student may transfer to the receiving school district at any time during the school year.

- B. On or before September 1 Within twenty (20) days of approving an application for transfer, it shall be the duty of the superintendent of the receiving school district to file with the State Board of Education and each resident district a statement showing the names name of the students student granted transfers a transfer to the school district, the resident school district of the transferred students student and their respective the grade level of the student.
- C. The receiving school district of a student transferred pursuant to the provisions of this act shall notify the resident school district and parents of the student of a cancellation of the transfer. Such The notice shall be made by June 1 prior to the

school year for which the cancellation is applicable within ten (10) days of the cancellation.

D. For students who are deaf or hearing impaired who wish to transfer to a school district with a specialized deaf education program, applications may be filed at any time during the school year. Upon approval of the receiving school district, the student may transfer to the receiving school district at any time during the school year.

SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 8-103.1, is amended to read as follows:

Section 8-103.1 A local school district board of education which receives a request for a transfer for a student who does not reside in the school district may refuse the transfer in accordance with the provisions of the open transfer policy adopted by the local school district board of education. Each local board of education shall adopt an open transfer policy for the school district which specifies its criteria and standards for approval of transfers of students who do not reside in the district. The policy shall include, but shall not be limited to, provisions relating to the availability of programs, staff, or space as criteria for approval or denial of transfers. A school district may include in the policy as the basis for denial of a transfer, the reasons outlined in Section 24-101.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title. A school district may include in the policy deadlines for when

applications for transfer may be filed and accepted by the school district.

In considering requests for students to transfer into a school district, the board of education shall consider the requests on a first-come, first-serve basis. A school district shall not accept or deny a transfer based on ethnicity, national origin, gender, income level, disabling condition, proficiency in the English language, measure of achievement, aptitude, or athletic ability.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Education Open Transfer Act, transfers of children with disabilities shall be granted as authorized in Section 13-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title.

SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 35e, is amended to read as follows:

Section 35e. A. It shall be the duty of the superintendent, principal or head teacher of each public or private middle, junior high and high school accredited by the State Department of Education in the State of Oklahoma to notify the State Department of Education quarterly as scheduled by the Department of the name, address, race and age of any pupil dropping out from such the school during the preceding quarter. Such The report shall be made on forms prescribed and furnished by the State Department of Education.

B. The Oklahoma State Board of Education shall cause these statistics of school dropouts to be tabulated by grade and school

- district. Information of school dropouts shall be made available to
  the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education, the

  Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission, the Bureau of Indian Affairs and
  the State Department of Health, Education and Welfare.
  - C. The State Department of Education shall make an annual report to the Legislature prior to the convening of each regular session thereof of information received and tabulated pursuant to this section.

- D. For the purposes of this section, for calculation of the

  Academic Performance Index, for reporting in the Oklahoma

  Educational Indicators Program, and any other purposes required by

  law, school dropout means any student who is under the age of

  nineteen (19) eighteen (18) and has not graduated from high school
  and is not attending any public or private school or is otherwise

  receiving an education pursuant to law for the full term the schools
  of the school district in which he the student resides are in

  session.
- SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.509, is amended to read as follows:
- Section 1210.509 A. The Department shall provide in-service training for local school personnel who administer tests required by the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act, Section 1210.505 et seq. of this title.

- B. The Board shall require the company or companies providing tests required by the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act, Section 1210.505 et seq. of this title, to submit summary reports of the results by school district to the Department and the respective local school district. Individualized results of the test shall be made available by the local school district to the classroom teachers who instruct the students in the academic areas tested. In every year, prior to the convening of the Legislature, the Board shall give a summary report on the testing results to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- C. School counselors certified by the Department shall not be required by local school districts to coordinate tests required by the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act.
  - SECTION 8. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.
- SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
